Enter from the south lot off South 227th Street

Only the Following Items Will be Accepted.....



- •ELECTRONIC/COMPUTER EQUIPMENT: DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, scanners, and cellular phones (remove personal information). Computers and monitors, mouse, keyboards, tablet computers, and e-readers. For free regular collection of computers, monitors, and TVs, visit EcycleWA.org. \$5.00 cash only charge for each printer and copier.
- •TELEVISION SETS: TV sets encased in plastic, wood console, sets encased in wood, and big screen TVs accepted (no charge).screen TVs accepted (no charge).
- •TIRES: Limit 6 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. \$3 for each extra tire. \$6 for all passenger tires on rims. \$15 charged for each large truck tire and \$30 charged for each truck tire on rim (cash only). No oversized tires accepted.
- •LEAD ACID BATTERIES: Car, truck, marine, motorcycle, and sealed lead acid batteries accepted.
- •ALKALINE BATTERIES: AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell alkaline batteries. No rechargeable, cell phone, or nicad batteries accepted. <u>Lithium-ion batteries</u>, <u>like tool and vape batteries</u>, <u>will not be accepted. Visit Call2Recycle.org for more battery recycling options.</u>
- •PROPANE TANKS: Residential tanks only. \$10 charge (cash only).
- •PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS: Toilet seats, hardware, and base wax rings must be removed. \$25 charge (cash only).
- •APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL: Household appliances, auto parts, engines and gas lawnmowers (drained of oil and gasoline), metal lawn chairs, stoves, barbecues, iron, steel, aluminum, brass, copper and other ferrous and nonferrous metals. \$5 (cash only) will be charged for each water heater that still has insulation coating. Metals that are insulated, rubber or oil coated, previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials will not be accepted. No light fixture ballasts or sealed drums accepted. Any item that contains gas or oil will be rejected.
- •REFRIGERATORS/FREEZERS: \$35 (cash only) will be charged for each refrigerator or freezer. \$35 (cash only) will be charged for each household air conditioner. Please be prepared to pay at event entrance.
- •BULKY WOOD: Includes tree branches (minimum 6 inches in diameter), logs, clean wood, plywood, pallets, and other untreated and unpainted wood. No leaves, grass, small branches, sod, or brush. Please lay a tarp under material for ease of removal.
- •MATTRESSES/BOX SPRINGS: Mattresses and box springs any size. \$35 per mattress and \$35 per box spring (cash only). Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle. No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items.

Please provide exact change for user fees.

NO CARDBOARD: Please recycle cardboard in your curbside recycling bin.

PLEASE NOTE: HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING will <u>not</u> be accepted. This material can be self hauled to donation locations in the local area. CALL FIRST TO CONFIRM LOCATIONS ARE OPEN AND ACCEPTING MATERIAL.

PLEASE ALSO NOTE: STYROFOAM BLOCKS will not be accepted. Recology King County provides free curbside collection of Styrofoam blocks for Des Moines Residential Customers. Household hazardous wastes (but not latex paint) can be taken to any of the Seattle/King County Household Hazardous Waste facilities. City residents can use the South Seattle Household Hazardous Waste Facility – 8100 2nd Ave S, Seattle, WA, 98108. Located across the street from the transfer station. Open 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday (except major holidays). There is a limit of 25 gallons of gasoline and a limit of 50 gallons of other automotive fluids per trip. Containers should be labeled and must be 5 gallons or smaller. Customers can have gas containers back upon request. Separate motor (crankcase) oil from all other fluids. Pure crankcase oil containers will be returned. No latex paint is accepted. See www.paintcare.org/wa for more information on paint collection.

Please note that computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are not included in this program but will be accepted at City Recycling Collection Events. Beware, it is always a good idea to remove all personal information from any item you are recycling - better safe than sorry.

To encourage the use of recycled content material and more efficient use of water, the City is offering discounted recycled plastic rain barrels. In addition, start backyard composting with a compost bin to save resources and money. Composting is a natural process that turns yard waste into rich soil. Once the material decomposes, rich soil is all that's left. Worm bin composting is an efficient way to convert kitchen scraps into nutrient-rich compost for your garden. Simple to assemble and can be stored inside or out.
