# City Manager Weekly Report January 12, 2024

#### **Winter Road Preparation**

This week Public Works staff have been busy gearing up for the winter weather and icy conditions on the roads. Earlier this week forecasts were showing a potential for lowland snow, however that has changed to just a very cold but dry weekend. Our crews have applied deicer to the roads and will be on standby as needed to ensure our streets are safe to travel. Please do your part by exercising caution!

#### **Des Moines Theater Update**

Last Friday, the City approved the issuance of a temporary certificate of occupancy for the residential units of the Des Moines Theater. Construction will continue on the commercial aspects of the building, but you may soon begin seeing new neighbors moving into the building. More info on the building can be found here.

#### **Public Safety**

In alignment with our commitment to community well-being, the City of Des Moines has taken proactive steps to secure 120 boxes of Naloxone (Narcan) courtesy of the Washington State Department of Health. Naloxone is a safe and effective measure to assist individuals experiencing an overdose. They will be available to our staff and first responders in order to equip them with the necessary tools to promptly respond and provide assistance to individuals who may have overdosed.

#### **Zenith Draft Environmental Impact Statement**

On Tuesday, the City issued a Notice of Draft Environmental Impact Statement Availability, Public Comment Period and Public Meeting for the Zenith Properties Demolition Application at the former Masonic Home/Landmark on the Sound. The public comment period is open January 9, 2024 until 4:30 p.m. on February 22, 2024. A virtual public meeting will also be held on Wednesday, January 31, 2024 at 6 p.m. The meeting will begin with a brief presentation about the draft EIS, followed by public comments. A court reporter will attend to transcribe verbal comments. All comments will be recorded and become part of the public record. The meeting will end after the last comment is made. Participants must register to receive the link and join from a computer or tablet on the Zoom platform to provide verbal comment during this event. Register here.

### **Meetings of Interest**

I met several times with Mayor Buxton to discuss recent topics of interest to her as well as to discuss and finalize Committee assignments. I met with Mayor Buxton and Deputy Mayor Steinmetz to prepare for the City Council meeting. I also met with Councilmember Harris to discuss topics of interest to him. I met with the City's Directors and senior staff to discuss ongoing and upcoming issues. Finally, I met with the President of Destination Des Moines to talk about 2024 community events and City collaboration with DDM.

#### **City Council Meeting Summary**

The City Council met on January 11<sup>th</sup>. The full agenda and supporting materials from the 11<sup>th</sup> can be found <u>here.</u> Highlights from the meeting included adopting the Council's 2024 Legislative Priorities, establishing a new Council Finance Committee and approving the Request for Proposals for an executive search firm for the City Manager vacancy.
