

City Manager Weekly Report August 8, 2024

Proposition 1 and Upcoming Budget Retreat

Based on the current results from King County Elections, it appears the City's Proposition 1 did not get the necessary votes to pass. This Proposition would have provided dedicated funding to support police and public safety services and would have insulated the police department from budget cuts that will be occurring when the 2025-26 biannual budget is adopted. City staff have been preparing a proposed budget with and without additional public safety funding and we will be bringing forward budget strategies at the City Council's Budget Retreat on September 5 that will provide potential avenues for cost reduction strategies. The City currently has 4 positions in the police department (including 2 patrol officer positions) that were funded by expiring COVID recovery funds which will be eliminated and the Redondo substation will be closed permanently.

Further budget cuts will be required across all City departments as a result of several years of inflation outpacing revenue the City receives through taxes, fees and other sources. Residents are encouraged to attend the Council's upcoming Budget Retreat as well as City Council meetings to let your voice be heard about what services are important to you and where you believe services can be discontinued.

Redondo Restroom Replacement Project Update

The Redondo Restroom Replacement Project will begin construction on Monday August 12th, with an anticipated completion date in spring of 2025. The single car parking area in the Redondo Parking Lot will be closed during construction which will likely result in street parking impacts during this timeframe. As always, City staff will diligently monitor parking demand and take necessary measures to accommodate additional parking as needed. The City appreciates the public's patience and understanding as we move forward with construction and we look forward to the completion of this great project.

I met with Mayor Buxton to discuss the City Manager recruitment process. I met with Mayor Buxton and Deputy Mayor Steinmetz to prepare for the upcoming City Council meeting. I met with the Finance Director and Assistant City Manager to review options as a result of the Levy Lid Lift not passing. I hosted a roundtable with the City's Department Director's to discuss ongoing and upcoming issues. I met with representatives of several City departments including Community Development, Public Works and Parks & Recreation to discuss a potential long term lease of the City's Beach Park buildings. Finally, I attended the City Council meeting on Thursday night.
