Council Adopts 2025-2026 Budget

At last night's City Council meeting, the City Council unanimously approved the 2025-2026 biennial budget. If you're an avid reader of these City Manager reports, then you'll recall last week's lengthy write up about the budget. This year's budget development took place during a unique transitional period for the City. City Attorney Tim George served as the Interim City Manager for one year, beginning in November 2023. I joined the City as the new City Manager in early November 2024 and collaborated closely with senior staff to understand the existing draft budget. Record-high inflation, ongoing economic uncertainty, declining revenues, the failure of Proposition 1, and the conclusion of one-time federal funding from the CARES and ARPA Acts resulted in a budget gap exceeding \$4 million that needed to be addressed. Through a combination of targeted spending reductions, consolidation of programs and services, generating new revenue streams, and reducing expenses associated with the workforce, this budget provides a basic level of service for core functions such as Public Safety, infrastructure maintenance, and other core local government functions. While the reductions in services and programs will undoubtedly affect community members, we will do everything possible to minimize these impacts.

For the first time in several years, the City's budget is structurally balanced, and we are growing our Fund Balance. In other words, we are not overspending and actually sending money to our savings account!

Although I am very pleased with the final budget and incredibly appreciative of the City Council's support of this plan, we must grow revenues in order to expand services in the future and remain financially stable.

Katherine's Fun Stuff

OATMEAL CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

These are NOT your typical oatmeal cookies...they are soft, chewy and delicious. I also definitely recommend you use the best butter and chocolate chips you can—makes a world of difference. Because my husband is Irish, we're a devoted Kerrygold family and I love Ghiradelli chocolate chips best.

1 stick unsalted butter at room temp
1 cup turbinado sugar (Yes! Use this specifically—if you must substitute, do brown sugar)
1 large egg at room temp
2 tsp vanilla extract
1 ¼ c old fashioned oats (don't use quick or instant!)
2/3 c all purpose flour
1 c bittersweet chocolate chips (I highly recommend 60% bittersweet Ghiradelli)
1 tsp baking powder
½ t baking soda
½ t kosher salt
½ t cinnamon
¼ t allspice

·Pre-heat the oven to 350 degrees and adjust the oven rack (or racks if you have 2 ovens) to the middle position.

Line 2 large rimmed baking sheets with parchment paper.

Get out your standing mixer and insert your paddle attachment!

Add to the mixing bowl, the stick of butter and the 1 cup sugar. Cream the butter and sugar together on medium-high speed for 30 seconds, then increase the speed to high for up to 2 to 2-1/2 minutes, or until light and fluffy.

Add in the egg and the 2 teaspoons vanilla. Mix the ingredients on medium speed until well combined.

Add in the 1 - ¼ cup old-fashioned oats, ⅔ cup all-purpose flour, 1 cup bittersweet chocolate chips, 1 teaspoon baking powder, ½ teaspoon baking soda, ½ teaspoon fine kosher salt, ½ teaspoon cinnamon and the ¼ teaspoon allspice.

Refrigerate the batter for 15 minutes or so. This step helps to firm up the cookie batter a bit, as well as gives you time to clean up the kitchen!

Divide the dough into 8 portions per cookie sheet, and space them out approximately 2 inches apart.

Bake the cookies 1 tray at a time (or both trays if you have a double oven) until the cookies are golden brown along the edges, but still puffy and a bit soft in the center, 11 to 12 minutes. They will firm up once they are out of the oven.

Enjoy! Eat as many as you can until your stomach hurts, then declare defeat—and share the rest with your family.
