



### CITY MANAGER REPORT THE WATERLAND CITY

FEBRUARY 7, 2025

The February 6 City Council Study Session was very busy! The Council discussed several critical topics, including Marina Steps, Redondo Pier, forming an Airport Committee, and re-establishing a Planning Commission.

### MARINA STEPS AND Redondo Fishing Pier

The City Council has voted to advance two major capital projects, the Redondo Pier improvements and the Marina Steps, linking the marina to downtown.

Earlier, the City issued bonds to fund these projects, but bids for both projects were higher than anticipated. The available bond funds will not cover both projects as originally designed.

On Feb. 6, many community members attended a City Council study session to give input on how to move forward.

After hearing from community members, the Council directed staff to:

- Fully complete the Redondo Pier project using bond funds
- Authorize \$100,000 for "value engineering" of the Marina Steps and to come back to the council with lower-cost design options.
- Provide information on the feasibility of a sling boat launch and dry stack boat storage at the marina. (We will discuss this item at the February 13 City Council meeting)



## MARINA STEPS & REDONDO PIER (CONT.)

#### **Redondo Pier**

The Redondo Pier project is currently being redesigned to reduce costs. It will go out to bid this spring.

- The estimated cost of the Redondo Pier project is \$7 million.
- If permitting is completed in time, construction of the project could begin later this year and open early 2026.
- Receiving permits from the State and Army Corps of Engineers is a complex and lengthy process. If permitting takes longer, the City would begin work in 2026 and complete the pier in early 2027.(The timing of the in-water construction must be done at certain times during the year to protect fish life)
- Restrooms at the Redondo Pier were grantfunded and are already under construction. They are expected to open in spring 2025.

### Marina Steps

Through the value engineering process, the Marina Steps will be redesigned to reduce costs. Some elements of the original design could be removed or scaled back while maintaining the key purpose: linking the downtown business district to the marina.

- A redesign would retain all structural elements necessary for public safety and the integrity of the condos along the bluff.
- The redesigned option(s) would be presented at a City Council meeting this spring. The Council will then decide whether to proceed with the project.
- City staff estimates that after a redesign, the Marina Steps could be completed for about \$12 million. Additional funds beyond bond dollars would need to be secured to complete the project.







### MARINA STEPS & REDONDO PIER FAQS

#### Where will the City get funding to complete the Redondo Pier and/or the Marina Steps?

The City Council has directed staff to utilize bond funds to pay for 100% of the Pier project. Remaining bond funds, grants, and other funds will be used for the Marina Steps. City staff will return to the City Council with financial options for how to fully fund that project.

#### Can the City use the bond funds for projects other than the pier and steps?

State law does give cities the flexibility to direct funds to different areas–within limits–based on the priorities of the community. The City Council must amend the Bond Ordinance to direct bond funds to other capital needs. Bond funds can only be used for capital projects, not staffing or ongoing operations.

#### Will residents be taxed to pay for pier and/or steps projects?

There is no plan to raise taxes to generate funds for the pier or Marina Steps. Once the Council reviews the cost of redesigned plans, they would determine whether to prioritize funding to complete one or both projects.

### Could the redesigned plans be more likely to lead to a landslide on the bluff where the Marina Steps would be built?

The safety of our residents is our top priority. The engineering contractor would not suggest, nor would the City entertain, any design changes that compromise safety or impact the structural integrity of condos near the steps.

#### What other capital projects are underway in the city?

- The City's marina dock replacement project is moving forward with bond funds and dollars from the Marina Enterprise fund. The bid for dock replacement came in \$1.66 million under estimate, and the savings will be used for other needs, potentially including the pier or the steps.
- The new restrooms and paid parking at Redondo Pier will open this spring.
- A project to enhance the Memorial Drive Flag triangle as a gateway to the city is in the bidding process.

#### Why were the bids for the pier and steps projects above budget?

The estimates for these projects were developed more than two years ago by staff under the previous administration. Building material and labor costs have increased significantly since then, and some elements of the original design required higher-cost materials or techniques. The redesign process allows the City to develop estimates in line with current construction costs and to look for more cost-effective design features.



## MARINA STEPS & REDONDO PIER FAQS (CONT.)

### Why does the City have funds for capital projects when the City budget has been cut and police and staff positions have been eliminated?

The City's operations (or general fund) budget is separate from the capital budget. By law, capital funds, such as bond funds, cannot be spent for day-to-day city operations.

#### What is "value engineering"?

Value engineering analyzes a project's design elements, materials, and construction methods to identify cost-saving alternatives without sacrificing functionality. This is the goal of redesigning the Redondo Pier and Marina Steps.

### What options does the City Council have for spending the bond funds?

- Direct staff to have the projects redesigned or "value engineered" to lower costs, and secure additional funding to complete both projects.
- Direct the bond funds to one project or the other.
- Direct bond funds to other capital needs.

### **AIRPORT COMMITTEE**

The Council received comprehensive public feedback from local airport advocacy groups regarding the strategy for establishing an Airport Committee. In the coming weeks, the Council will further discuss the guidelines for this committee.

### **PLANNING COMMISSION**

In my few months here in Des Moines, numerous residents have told me the City needs to reestablish its Planning Commission. At last night's meeting, the City Council received a presentation on what this could look like. Des Moines previously had a citizen-led "Planning Agency" until it was dissolved in 2013. Now, there is renewed interest in bringing it back.

A Planning Commission is an advisory body appointed by the City Council to help guide long-term growth and development. While the City Council makes final land use and policy decisions, the Planning Commission provides recommendations and ensures community input is considered. It serves as a bridge between the public and the government, with members drawn from the local community.

The Council has directed staff to explore recommendations for the commission's role and structure. We'll keep you updated as more information becomes available.
