New Police Chief Announced

The City announced this week the selection of Ted Boe to lead the police department as the City's new Chief of Police. Ted Boe has served as Burien's Chief of Police since 2018. Prior to Burien, he served 18 years in the King County Sheriff's Office, as Sergeant, Precinct Operations Captain, and Major Investigations Section Captain in Seattle, Burien, and SeaTac. 24th Avenue South Improvements Project Update

We are happy to announce that the construction of the 24th Avenue South Improvements Project will resume soon!

The construction of the 24th Avenue South Improvements Project was temporarily on hold due to direct conflicts with existing utility poles owned by Puget Sound Energy (PSE). The City and the contractor have been working diligently together with PSE to address these challenges and minimize the schedule impacts.

On June 10, 2024 PSE informed the City that they have now completed the removal of all conflicting utility poles. The construction of the 24th Avenue South Improvements Project is targeted to resume on **June 17, 2024**. The City team is exploring all options to bring the project back on track. We understand the inconvenience caused by the delay, and we appreciate the community's patience and continued support.

South 216th Street Bridge Reopening

The new South 216th Street bridge across I-5 opened to two-way traffic the morning of Wednesday, June 5, ending a six-month detour for eastbound travelers. Travelers can expect ongoing lane closures to install curb, gutter, sidewalk, and final paving on South 216th Street as work continues on the WSDOT SR 509 Completion Project.
