Redondo Boarding Floats/Docks Update

The new Redondo boarding floats/docks were recently removed as the new pile hoops were too tight, causing an unsafe condition during high and low tides. The new pile hoops were picked up this Thursday from the galvanizers and they are currently being mounted to the docks. Marina staff will tow them to Redondo and install everything on Wednesday of next week.

Community Decarbonization Grant Award

The City of Des Moines is officially a Community Decarbonization awardee! The Department of Commerce announced \$72.6 million in funding for 71 projects across 24 Washington counties. These projects will including solar, hydrogen fueling, microgrids and more in communities most impacted by carbon pollution and climate change.

Des Moines was awarded \$228,200 for solar installation on our Des Moines Senior Activity Center. This was a competitive grant with a short window of time to apply. A big shout-out to Executive Administrative Analyst Rochelle Caton, and Citizen's Advisory Committee member, Ryan Crompton, for their efforts and being instrumental in securing this grant.

Grant funds will include a <u>full</u> roof replacement of the Senior Activity Center. It is estimated that the Solar Panels will offset over 50% of the monthly electrical costs.

This community decarbonization grant award is supported with funding from Washington's Climate Commitment Act. The CCA supports Washington's climate action efforts by putting cap-and-invest dollars to work reducing climate pollution, creating jobs, and improving public health.
