Happy Senator Karen Keiser Appreciation Day!

If you weren't already aware, the Des Moines City Council has proclaimed today (May 3, 2024) as Senator Karen Keiser Appreciation Day! Recently the most senior member of the Washington State Senate, and our City's representative, Karen Keiser announced that she will be retiring from the Senate later this year. Senator Keiser has served the people of the 33rd Legislative District and the people of the State of Washington for the last 29 years. Marina Paid Parking Update
