# MAYOR'S REPORT

Proclamation - "Museum Month"

Suburban Mayors' are meeting on May 7th at the new Double Tree, 16500 South Center Parkway. Reservations must be in by May 2nd. Mayor Hine indicated that she will be attending.

# COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Salary Ordinance</u> - Councilman Mannard requested that the Committee studying the salary ordinance meet on Thursday evening.

Park Board & Design Commission Minutes - Mayor Hine called attention to the minutes of the Park and Design Board in Council packets.

Library Board - Ms. Rickelton, Librarian at the Des Moines Library told the Council that the Library Board feels that a Public Meeting is the best way to solicit comments from and get information to the public on the following:

1. Reassure the community that the Library on 24th Ave. is not going to be moved

away.

2. To ascertain the feelings of the community about the present services.

3. To secure documentation from the community on Library needs in the event it is the decision that the Board attempt to secure a grant for a new building or a community center.

At a Public Meeting there will be the opportunity for general discussion and questionnaires will be distributed for completion at that meeting. The Library Board is particularly anxious to get information from students and from the schools before school is dismissed.

Also in the audience were Library Board members Melanie Draper, Bob Boyd and Jim Elsey.

Mayor Hine responded that she appreciates the Library Board's coming to the meeting and that she feels that this is an excellent way to test the community.

### ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

Sewer District Project - (City Manager) Mr. McNutt introduced Bill Beattie, Manager of the Des Moines Sewer District, who reported on the Interceptor Project which has been under construction for some time. He told the Council that the dumping on the lot which they own on 220th approximately 12th, is just about completed. He stated that the contract includes seeding for that property.

Barnes Creek Trail restoration will be completed within the month. (Bill Beattie)

<u>Councilman Mannard</u> expressed concern about the condition of the City streets because of construction, pointing out that there has to be an end to the constant street mess.

Storm Damage of January 12th (City Manager) A letter has been sent to each of the six claimants in Heartland Homes apprising them of the status of their claim. A copy of the letter which was sent to Mr. Singh was also included. It is being turned over to his insurance company and attorney, for review. He has been given forty days from April 28th to make settlement.

Mr. McNutt asked the Council to give direction if they wish to have the damages handled in any other way, such as disbursing the \$5,000 on deposit from Mr. Singh.

Mayor Hine responded that she feels that the City must respond to the citizens in the best way possible, but the City also has to protect public funds and follow legal process so that there is the least possibility of having to expend City funds. She said Administration has acted most appropriately, but regrets the delay.

- <u>Singh Court Case</u> (City Attorney) Mr. Gorham reported that he has filed the transcript with Superior Court and expects to get an early hearing.
- Street Construction (City Engineer) Mr. Stair reported that the first Portland Cement Concrete sidewalk has been installed in the City in accordance with Ordinance No. 456 (230' at 225th and 6th Avenue).
- Marine View Drive Sidewalks will be swept and flushed on April 29th. This is being done on a trial basis.
- Highway 99 In the process of paving shoulders. Next phase is construction and overlayment of complete five lanes. Fifth lane will be operational in the early part of summer.
- Prospectus has been submitted to UAB for <u>Overlayment of 16th Avenue</u>. Hope to award contract end of May.
- <u>Building Permits</u> (City Engineer) Mr. Stair reported that he is now working on three building permits totaling \$10 million. Thirteen applications have come in from February 28th to April 21st.
- Temporary Parking improvement back of City Buildings (City Manager Mr. McNutt said a plan for temporary gravel parking area in back of City buildings has been developed. Approximate cost would be \$1,000 with City crew doing the work.

Councilman Mannard pointed out than an entire landscape plan should be made for City property and this would clearly be temporary with the gravel being non-retrievable.

MOTION Motion was made by Councilman Mannard, seconded by Councilman Whisler that the Council support the City Manager in providing temporary parking behind the buildings. Motion passed.

Board Vacancies (City Clerk) There is till one vacancy on the Park Board, one on Art Commission and one on Planning Commission.

Friend to Friend (City Clerk) Karen Lepper has moved into City Hall.
