Chief's Message:



Getting People Services Team

The GPS Team assisted patrol with a suicidal subject at the Woodmont Library. The 9-1-1 call came in as a 32 year old male who was considering walking to the nearest bridge and jumping into traffic.

We arrived on scene and made contact with the young man. He was new to the area and had no family or support system in place for his mental challenges. We were able to talk with him and his family back home in Arkansas. After talking with us he decided that he needed help and agreed to go to the hospital. We were able to connect him with a treatment center if he would go to the hospital to get stabilized and then sent to a treatment center for more intense work. We continue to do outreach tables at Safeway and apartment complexes to share the Services team program and give resources for mental health services and eviction prevention.



Downtown Des Moines Revitalization

Code Enforcement is working on several code enforcement issues in the downtown core of Des Moines. Cleaning up of vacant lots and code violations for several vacant businesses. Revitalization of our downtown is important to all of us!

Pacific Highway South

Code Enforcement continues to work closely with the businesses along the highway as a part of our Pacific Hwy South Safety Emphasis, working with owners and property managers to actively prevent crime and disorder on their properties by way of property maintenance required by code.

Graffiti abatement, trespassing and vandalism are a few of the challenges these businesses continue to face. The focus on quick, consistent cleanup and repair shows the space is cared for and the behavior is not tolerated.

Code Enforcement also has a significant role in the prevention of these issues, being a visible presence and making contact with individuals found trespassing on private properties. Individuals who are found to be homeless, are referred to available resources and our GPS team. Code Enforcement fields numerous day to day calls about quality of life issues throughout the rest of the City to include reports of garbage, graffiti, junk vehicles and unpermitted work.

Criminal Investigations Unit

Armed Robbery

An armed robbery occurred at the 7-11 located at 820 Kent Des Moines Road. The victim employee described the suspects as wearing face coverings. The suspects both had handguns and demanded the employee open the cash drawer which he did. The suspects fled the business and we continue to investigate.

Another armed robbery occurred in the 24200 block of 26th Pl. S. The victim reported his backpack was stolen that contained his wallet, and 20,000.00 dollars. We continue to track down leads.

Shooting

There was a shooting that occurred at 2459 S. 216th St. Rifle casings were recovered and the victim was transported to Valley Hospital where he has since left against medical advice. Detective Stillwagon drafted a search warrant for the vehicle that the victim was shot in. The victim has not yet responded to Detective Still wagon's multiple attempts to speak with him.
