



# From the Council

A s we all know, the City of Des Moines has struggled financially for a considerable period of time. Rather than constantly asking our residents to pay more in taxes, we believe that growing a vibrant and diverse economic base is the best solution to solve this longstanding problem.

For the better part of the past eight to ten years the City Council has been working hard to make Des Moines more competitive with other cities, and to help lay the foundation for bringing development and new businesses to town. We've made our zoning more flexible, improved our permitting and inspection processes, provided incentives to spur construction, built roadway improvements to support our business park, and adopted more stringent nuisance ordinances to go after property owners who refuse or struggle to maintain their properties. Collectively, all of these changes are beginning to make things happen.

Just like turning a large ship at sea, it doesn't stop on a dime, and the gradual turn only happens slowly, but we are just now beginning to see the fruits of our efforts.

In the Marina: we have

been in conversations with a number of developers that have floated concepts for bringing businesses to the Marina floor. Some are way out of scale to what we envision (or are practical), and others just haven't met our expectations. Both the Council and staff are carefully considering which parts of the Marina should be developed and how, with a constant eye on keeping the Marina a fullyfunctioning and financially successful business as a first priority.

In the Marina District (downtown): the Adriana senior housing project, the Dougherty retail/office building, the Clayt's tavern property, and the Des Moines Theatre are all at various stages in the ground breaking or design review process. There is another apartment/retail project on 7th Avenue S. that has submitted for design review.

In the middle of Des Moines: Wesley Homes has come in requesting a master plan for reconstructing the Gardens (on the south side of S. 216th, west of 11th Ave S). This huge project will take out cottages, build a new Gardens building and independentliving apartments, and provide a more village-like feel to the campus. Landmark on the Sound (the old Masonic home) has received a number of offers for purchase and development, but a decision on who to sell to has not yet happened. We

have been encouraging the Masons to choose a purchaser that will keep the existing building (or façade), and who will bring business here that will contribute to our economic base.

In the Des Moines Creek Business Park: Phase 1 (up near S. 208th and 24th Ave S.) has already been graded, the first concrete slabs have been poured, and soon we will see the tilt-up concrete walls go up. According to the developer, there are already tenants for their first buildings, and an employer with hundreds of employees will move in January 2016. In Phase 2 (near S. 216th), the land will soon be cleared in preparation of constructing the Federal Aviation Administration facility. The FAA will bring about 1600 employees to town, providing many more potential customers for our existing businesses ... and hopefully some new ones.

In Pacific Ridge: the Sheraton Four Point Hotel (previously named Artemis) is well underway, and should be completed by the end of this year, and open early next year. At least a half dozen large projects have been discussed with staff regarding Pacific Ridge, but specific designs have not yet come in. When they do, we'll see a lot more activity up on Hwy 99.

On Pacific Highway South of Kent-Des Moines Road: Highline Place (just north of Baskin Robbins) has already knocked down existing buildings, and is preparing to do the grading necessary to start construction. This \$50 million two phase project will provide apartments right next to Highline College (to the benefit of students), retail spaces, and office space. The College has been talking to the developer to secure space there. This will become an important entrance for Highline College. Further down Hwy 99, the Woodmont Recovery Center is also getting ready to break ground.

On top of all of these commercial developments, there are at least four residential housing projects that will add over 125 homes to Des Moines. With all of the small housing projects that were put on hold prior to the start of the real estate downturn, we have a lot of potential housing options being built.

As you can see, there's a lot going on. Watch for updates on these and other projects as they develop over the next several months.

While we're working through our financial challenges, our City's future remains bright ... and is getting brighter. We all want to see our potential realized, and with the efforts we're making, and everyone's support, we will.

#### **City Council Adopts Comprehensive Plan Update**

"Des Moines 2035 – Charting Our Course for a Sustainable Future" (the Comprehensive Plan) is the City's official policy statement with respect to growth and development in Des Moines. It is a 20-year plan that articulates our community's vision and values about how we will grow and thrive into the future. The goals, policies and implementation strategies included in the Plan provide a basis for the City's regulations and guide future decision-making. The Plan addresses anticipated population, housing and employment growth, and how facilities and services will be maintained or improved to accommodate expected growth between now and the year 2035.

The updated plan reflects input received from the community during open houses; tabling events at the Farmers Market, Des Moines and Woodmont Libraries, and Highline College; a community survey (in Spanish and English language) that was posted on the City's website; and City Council meetings. 
# Online Permitting a Great Success!

The City of Des Moines Building Department implemented an online permitting system in 2013 and it has been a great success. Of the 682 total permits issued in the first six months of 2015, 28% of those were applied for online.

Online permitting is available for the following RESIDENTIAL permits only: re-roof permits, plumbing, mechanical, and electrical permits. Through our online permitting system, you are able to submit a permit application, view your permits, review the status, request inspections, and check the current inspection schedule. This permitting option is available to contractors and home owners, and is very easy to navigate.

To use online permitting, go to desmoineswa. gov/mypermits, register by creating a user name and password, choose the type of permit you need, and go through the process step by step. Once you have submitted an online permit application, a Permit Specialist in the Building Division receives it, reviews it for accuracy, and emails the approved permit for you to print out at your home or office.

As a homeowner, you may wonder why you should get a permit or insist that your contractor get one. Being certain that work done on your home adheres to the International Building Code ensures that your home will be livable and safe for you and your family and others who may own your home in the future. All permitted work is inspected for code compliance and our inspectors and permit specialists are ready to help with information and guidance when you need it.





#### FALL HOUSING REPAIR ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The City of Des Moines is providing free minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines.

#### SERVICES PROVIDED include but not limited to:

- Electrical faulty lights, switches, plugs, or circuits



- 3. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or noneligibility. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.

# From the Chief



FOR THE PAST TWO YEARS, it seems that public support for police has declined significantly. It begins with an event that gains media attention, and then gathers momentum by way of the generated media reports before all of the facts of the situation have been

released. The problem is that law enforcement often can't provide investigative details due to the sensitive nature of the process. Before you know it, inaccurate information becomes the source of conflict between police and the community. Des Moines is not immune from the problems faced in communities across the country. However we do recognize the need to talk to our community about why we do what we do. More important, why we have to do what we have to do.

Not every public contact is dim and grim. Des Moines Police Officers working the graveyard shift recently encountered a citizen in need and worked as quickly and efficiently as possible to find the citizen shelter after meeting his needs and feeding him. They did all of this utilizing their own money. This story and so many others like it are overshadowed by stories of excessive force or corruption. Do hose things happen? Yes they do, and it is a major problem when it does happen. The Des Moines Police Department is highly committed to transparency and an open dialogue with our citizens. Our officers want our citizens to know what we deal with on a day to day basis, specifically on calls where force is used to affect an arrest.

For example, traffic stops where an arrest is mandatory due to an active warrant on file. In most cases, these encounters are dealt without any escalated use of force. There are those times when a person refuses to comply with the officer having to make an arrest. Whether out of fear or anger, people will sometimes refuse to comply and a struggle ensues. These are the cases news stories are made of. Someone with a cell phone camera will document the incident from one view point/angle and often times no back story showing the events that took place leading up to the filmed encounter, which then finds its way to the evening news and social media. Then comes the inquiry that's fueled by the last week's negative police story. As the video goes viral, departments are initiating their own inquiries in the matter. In the meantime, the involved officer(s) are wondering what just happened and whether they will still have a job. They're asking themselves whether their departments believe them and will support them, or fold to political pressure and fire them.

In this day and age, the above scenario has become every police officer's nightmare. As departments move toward more "sensitive" or "inclusive" approaches, officers are asking whether anyone is willing and open to better understand why an officer has to respond a certain way. Statistics show that communities around the country don't trust the police the way they once did. That fact coupled with the stark reality that assaults on police officer are rapidly rising. We, as your police department, would like to begin an expanded dialogue about police use of force and the dangers of our job. Over the next several issues, your Des Moines Police Officers and I will be sharing insight and experiences. We invite feedback or questions on this issue. Our goal is to use this forum as one of several ways to build public trust, increase dialogue, educate our community, and allow our officers to hear what your concerns are. Please take the time to join in our growing dialogue so that public trust can grow in our great community.

The Des Moines Police Department has an administrative process we use to investigate complaints from the public or other internal or external sources. Our goal is to determine whether a policy or polices were violated and/ or whether a law was violated. Equally as important to me is to ensure that our officers are not slandered or falsely accused of doing something they didn't do. We strive to be fair and just in our process.

As we continue to move ahead, I will share with you, our citizens, the progress we make, the challenges we face and a desire to do what we can to serve our community more effectively. Please feel free to contact me with ideas and suggestions for this column that I'll refer to as "From the Chief's Desk".

# Heat and your animals

Summertime is a fun time of year to enjoy with family, which includes our four-legged family members! We often take our doggies with us to the beach, picnics with friends, hiking in the woods, and strolling along the waterfront. There are many dog-oriented events to enjoy, such as charity dog walks, dog shows and obedience trials, pet parades, and county fairs. Find lots of fun things to do this time of year with your canine companion with the help of the internet.

Of course it is important to remember that our dogs can be affected by the heat of the summer sun, whether out on a walk or relaxing in a park. Dogs sweat only through the pads of their feet and by panting (not their entire bodies like people do). Their bodies are not very efficient at regulating heat, plus they are wearing a fur coat all year round!

Driving our dogs from home to our destination with the air conditioner on, your dog should stay nice and cool. However, stopping and turning off your vehicle and leaving your dog inside (even for a few short minutes) can quickly turn tragic, as it can get very hot inside a vehicle very quickly. Folks sometimes say they are just "stopping for a minute" to run into the grocery store for a few items, then unexpectedly bump into a friend and begin visiting, only to have time pass without notice.

I frequently get "Dog in a Hot Car" calls this time of year, due to dog owners not realizing how quickly the inside of a vehicle can get HOT! Even at a mild 70 degrees outside, the inside of a vehicle can guickly reach 104 degrees or more. Your furry friend can rapidly become distressed from heat exhaustion and possibly even die from heat prostration. Windows act like a magnifying glass increasing the intensity of the heat, in addition to the hot metal of the vehicle escalating the interior temperature. Even having windows down a bit cannot balance out how quickly it gets hot inside and being parked in the shade doesn't necessarily guarantee the vehicle won't get too hot.

Leaving a dog to suffer inside a hot vehicle can be an Animal Cruelty offense and the dog owner/keeper can possibly be issued a citation, and/or charged with a crime, arrested, and the dog seized and held as evidence. Worse yet, the dog could die.

Thankfully most of the calls I get turn out to




be opportunities for dog owner education and once we get the dogs out of the hot vehicle, a drink of water and into the shade, they are generally fine. Most are situations though, if too much time had elapsed before I arrived, the dog would NOT have been fine. I want to say "Thank You" to those who call us so we can respond!

Please think twice, then three times, then four times, before ever leaving your canine family member inside a potentially overheated vehicle. We love them too much to allow them to suffer and they depend on us to take good care of them.

#### **PICK UP AFTER YOUR PETS** Pet waste is a health issue for the whole family and the Environment

Pet waste contains disease-causing organisms that can be transmitted to people, pets and wildlife. Things like fecal coliform, bacteria, salmonella, roundworms and giardia can remain in your yard for weeks and months if not cleaned up.

Those little buggers can get tracked into the house on paws, shoes or little hands. And when it rains, pet waste left on the ground mixes with stormwater runoff and the contaminants are carried to nearby waterways causing harmful impacts to fragile ecosystems.

Landfills are designed to safely handle materials like dog waste. Yards and septic systems are not. If you are attached to a municipal sewer system, you can flush pet waste down the toilet (no kitty litter). Burying or composting pet waste is not safe.





Effective January 1, 2010, the City of Des Moines Implemented a Resident Discount Policy offering residents discounted fees for recreation programs. Non-residents and city residents who choose not to provide proof of residency will be assessed the full fee for programs.

The Resident Discount ("RD") Fee Is available to residents living within the City of Des Moines' jurisdictional boundaries and Senior Adults. To qualify for the "RD" Fee participants must provide proof of residency such as: Valid picture ID with a Des Moines address, Valid picture ID accompanied by a utility bill with their Des Moines Address. Sports Teams qualify for the "RD" Fee when 51% of their players are Des Moines residents (proof of residency will be requested.) The full program fee will be charged to participants who are not Des Moines residents or choose not to provide proof of residency. Questions related to residency should be directed to 206-870-6527.




