Des Moines Creek Business Park Developer Selected

Majestic Realty Company has been named the developer for the Des Moines Creek Business Park project and has entered into exclusive negotiations for a land lease agreement with the Port of Seattle. Majestic's selection is contingent on reaching agreement on the lease.

Majestic is a privately-held Southern California real estate development firm with regional offices throughout the country. The firm was chosen out of a field of 10 applicants to develop approximately 89 acres of property in Des Moines northwest of South 216th and 24th Avenue South with a combination of airport-related uses and a big-box anchor retail development.

Majestic's proposal was the most responsive to the objectives of the City of Des Moines and the Port of Seattle for a business park that balances commercial and retail uses that will help grow the City's tax base and support growth in air cargo. At full build-out the project will be over 1 million square feet of development including 234,000 square feet of retail, 231,000 of office/research and development and business services, and 535,000 of manufacturing and logistics. The project is expected to generate over 1,600 direct on site




Missoula Children's Theater Presents



The City's share is estimated at \$1.5 million a year.

Majestic's initial development budget for the project is estimated at \$73 million. Major portions of South 216th Street and 24th Avenue South fronting the project and connecting it to Pacific Highway South will be re-constructed. Business park development will include flexible-use buildings for users that need to be close to Sea-Tac Airport for their business such as freight, avionics manufacturers and air cargo company offices. Majestic will use the LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Green Building Rating System as a performance standard for designing the entire project.

The long-term ground lease with Majestic will be brought to the Port of Seattle Commission for final approval. The Des Moines City Council will approve a master plan for the site this fall before construction begins next year. A study session on the project with the City Council has been set for June 5th. The build-out of the project is expected to be in

three phases over five years, with ground breaking for the first phase as soon as the spring of 2009.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony - 16th Avenue So. Improvement Project

Please join us on June 23rd at 1:30 p.m. as we celebrate the completion of the new roadway, bicycle lanes and sidewalks along a mile of 16th Avenue S. from S. 260th St. to S. 272nd St., and thank neighbors for their patience through over a year of construction activity. The Des Moines City Council, along with invited guests from the State of Washington Transportation Improvement Board, Federal Way School District, Midway Sewer District, Highline Water District and other utilities that were so helpful in planning, funding and making this project a reality, will cut the ribbon on this first phase of the five-phase project. Come join the celebration, admire your new road and enjoy some refreshments as we gather in front of Woodmont Elementary School at 26454 16th Ave. S.

This is the first phase of a five-phase project that will eventually improve 16th Avenue S. from Pacific Highway S. at 279th to Kent-Des Moines Road. The roadway has been transformed from a two-lane rural road with open ditches to a landscaped city arterial that also includes:

- new water and sewer utilities with improved capacity and fire protection
- overhead wiring relocated onto only one side of the street reducing visual clutter
- · an underground storm drainage system
- a left turn lane with planted medians
- improved street lighting
- · a new, more clearly marked Woodmont Elementary school crossing, and
- a new improved signal system that is designed to reduce travel delay, particularly at Woodmont Drive S. & S. 260th St.

"It is wonderful to see a mix of people driving, walking and bicycle riding along the street including elderly and disabled persons walking to the Redondo shopping center, young students who now can safely walk to the Woodmont Elementary School, and bicyclists who easily share the road with vehicles," said Mayor Bob Sheckler. "It is now very pleasant to travel along this carefully landscaped corridor."

Retaining walls were constructed along the corridor to allow the wide sidewalks and a continuous bicycle lane. One of the concrete structural walls was innovatively sculptured to simulate a keyed stone wall that fits nicely in the residential setting.

Improvements on Woodmont Drive not only improved the steep grade of the intersection approaching 16th Avenue S., but also provide a walkway that enables lower Woodmont neighborhoods to more safely access the pedestrian improvements along 16th Avenue S. and S. 260th St.

S. 260th St. was also paved during the project and re-striped with a center turn lane and shoulders to integrate bicycle routing and provide better access to the Pacific Highway South commercial areas.

New Street Design and Construction Standards

The City of Des Moines is currently developing new Street Design and Construction Standards, which will replace the 1996 Street Development Standards. The new standards will provide uniform technical requirements to developers, utilities, engineers, and the general public when designing and constructing right-of-way improvements. A final draft of the standards will be available soon on the City's web site for review and public comment at www.desmoineswa.gov under Public Works/Engineering Highlights.



Summertime and the West Nile Virus

As summer approaches, public awareness of mosquitoes is very crucial. West Nile virus (WNv) infects humans, family pets, horses and other animals. Most of the time, infection with WNv makes people mildly ill. Symptoms include body aches, skin rashes and swollen glands. More severe infection can result in encephalitis with severe headache, high fever, neck stiffness, disorientation and sometime convulsions.

West Nile virus has steadily spread across the country since it was first detected in the New York City area in 1999. In 2007, we were very fortunate that WNv was not a significant problem in Western Washington. The Department of Health monitoring system detected one dead bird and eight horses that were positive for West Nile virus; and no positive human cases. This year Washington saw its first case confirmed in a dog. All 2007 cases were in Yakima County; the same year Idaho reported 108 human infections.

Graffiti "Tagging" on Infrastructure

We need your help to keep our City beautiful and safe.

Graffiti tagging continues to be a serious problem. In the last 12 months, there have been 350 incidents of graffiti involving public, commercial and private property with 20 cases currently under investigation. Traffic signs, culverts, retaining walls, fences, bridge abutments, and sidewalks have been the most frequent targets. City crewmembers have to take time from their regular duties to remove this vandalism.

Please be on the lookout for people that are carrying spray paint cans, brushes, etc. If you see suspicious behavior, please call 911 and furnish as much information as possible.

It's your dollars being wasted to clean up graffiti and it will take a community effort to stop this behavior. Thank you for your assistance.

The Benefits of Obtaining a Roofing Permit

As a homeowner you may wonder why you need a permit for re-roofing your home. First, it is required. However, more important is that there is real value in obtaining a permit because the City's Building Division can help you avoid many pitfalls and assure that you end up with a good roof.

Approximately 50% of inspected roofs need correction. Our inspectors regularly find these problems during their inspections:

- more than two layers of roofing on a building
- the wrong type of material or sheathing of the wrong thickness being used
- · inadequate slope for materials used
- flashing or roofing materials not installed according to the manufacturer's instructions

Inspectors also check for adequate attic ventilation because it increases roof life and prevents dry rot. Contractors are evaluated for current insurance, license and bond.

Transportation Open House June 10th at Des Moines City Hall

What do you want Des Moines to be like in 20 years? Do you envision a pedestrian-friendly community, a small town with quiet streets, multi-lane roadways with less congestion, more buses, more trails?

To plan for the future, the City is updating the Comprehensive Transportation

Plan (CTP). Over the next few months, City staff will examine the existing system and future needs for all the ways people travel around town – by vehicle, transit, and non-motorized modes. The City will identify the locations where traffic volumes are expected to grow in the next 20 years, where transit services are most likely to be needed, and where more roads and new bike lanes and sidewalks may be needed. These improvements will be identified, project cost estimates prepared and then the list will be put into the CTP. This will guide the City's decisions on when



and where to spend future transportation resources.

On Tuesday, June 10, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers at 21630 11th Avenue S., residents of Des Moines will have an opportunity to give their input. Join us at the Open House and let us know if all of your issues have been addressed in our study.

Des Moines City Council to Review Downtown Planning

Des Moines is updating the Downtown Neighborhood Element of the Des Moines Comprehensive Plan. The Downtown Neighborhood includes Downtown, the Marina and Beach Park. This update will help the City better achieve its goals for Downtown. A number of activities discussed over the past year also affect and shape the planning and development for Downtown. These relate to infrastructure planning, the Comprehensive Transportation Plan update, the Marina Master Plan, development regulations, the University of Washington Storefront Studio project, review of draft Downtown design guidelines, and the City's participation in the Main Street program. The culmination of these activities provides the information necessary to update the Downtown Element. City Council has begun to strategize on how best to complete this update and determine whether additional studies are warranted and the best approach for obtaining public input. The Council will continue its work on Downtown at its June 5th Study Session.

S. 216th St. Road and Sidewalk Improvements Planned

11th Avenue S. to Marine View Drive S.

The City of Des Moines is currently designing the S. 216th Street Sidewalk Project between Marine View Drive South and 11th Avenue S. This will provide for sidewalks and bicycle lanes on both sides of the street and a left turn



lane to assist turning movements to and from adjacent driveways and streets. The design is partially funded through a grant received from King County and the Wesley Homes Retirement Center.

These improvements will provide pedestrians, including many elderly and disabled citizens in the area, a safer access route between their homes, businesses and public transportation facilities throughout the Marine View Drive and S. 216th St. corridors. Access to facilities such as the Wesley Homes Retirement Center, Senior Activity Center, public library, and government offices located on 11th Avenue S. will be significantly improved.

The City is currently seeking construction funding for this project in the hope of beginning construction in the summer of 2010.

Recycle Food Waste - It's Easy To Do

- Des Moines residents can recycle food scraps and food-soiled paper in our yard waste carts.
- The average single-family household in King County produces 45 pounds of food waste every month.



- Instead of putting your food scraps and food-soiled paper in the garbage can, you can recycle them in your yard waste cart. You can recycle items such as fruit and vegetable trimmings, soiled paper towels and napkins, egg shells, coffee grounds, and even used pizza delivery boxes.
- By recycling your food scraps, what would otherwise end up in the Cedar Hills Regional Landfill is turned into nutrient-rich compost – a valuable resource that improves the health of our plants, crops and local gardens and parks. The use of compost has long-term environmental benefits to the

community, including improved soil health, reduction in pesticide use, erosion prevention and water savings. By putting your food scraps in the yard waste cart instead of the garbage can or by composting at home, you are also helping reduce a large portion of the garbage waste stream. This not only extends the life of our landfill, but also reduces the emissions of landfill-produced methane, a greenhouse gas that contributes to global

warming.

Street and Vegetation Maintenance

Vegetation control and road shoulder mowing is done on a limited basis along main arterials and state routes, including adjacent drainage ditches. Most residential vegetation control is the responsibility of adjacent property owners (Des Moines Municipal Code 12.32.010). Sight distance problems at intersections and low overhanging tree limbs and other vegetation that may encroach on public right-of-way and create a safety concern will be corrected as soon as possible.

Vegetation maintenance service is limited to priority concerns because there are only four employees dedicated to 100 miles of street and road maintenance tasks, which include:

- traffic control including sign maintenance and replacement, street painting, crosswalks, arrows, signal maintenance, guardrails, etc.
- roadway asphalt and pothole patching, shoulder work, gravel road maintenance including alley ways
- sidewalk maintenance and repairs
- vegetation maintenance, shoulder mowing, etc.

The Public Works Department works hard to maintain a clean and safe public right-of-way. Citizens' efforts to maintain vegetation adjacent to their property are very much appreciated. Problems that do require the attention of the Public Works Department should be reported to 206-870-6522.

Safe Routes to School

The City is partnering with the Highline School District in requesting grant funds for improvements near North Hill Elementary. The Safe Routes to School grant program is sponsored by the Washington State Department of Transportation. The grant application will seek funding to construct curb, gutter, sidewalk, and storm drainage improvements along the east side of 8th Ave. S. between the Samoan Church and S. 194th Street. We expect to know later this year if funding will be made available in 2009.

City of Des Moines' 50th Anniversary Grandstand Project

With the help of the Des Moines community, the Des Moines Legacy Foundation and outside grants, the City plans to restore, preserve and bring up to code, a community treasure and regional historic resource, the Baseball Grandstand at Des Moines Field House Park. The grandstand is currently closed due to structural deterioration.



Des Moines Field House Park was built in 1938 by a dedicated civic group with assistance by the Works Progress Act. The park became the first park in the King County Parks system. There are no other remaining historic wooden baseball grandstands in the King County Park System and only a handful of wooden grandstands standing in the northwest.

The park received King County Landmark designation in 1984 due to its significance as a strong example of Depression-era public architecture also known as CCC-style or Park Service Rustic, and was also identified as the first King County Park and is eligible for listing on both the Washington and National Historic Registers.

The Grandstand Restoration Project includes the following improvements: 1) removal of existing superstructure (walls, roof framing, roof sheathing, and roofing) 2) design and reconstruction of the superstructure; 3) reuse, repair or replacement of existing trim, railing, etc.; 4) repair to some areas of the seating structure which includes seating and seat framing; and 5) priming and painting of all new materials, as well existing surfaces. An Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) survey will be completed as part of the project to determine needed ADA modifications.

The Legacy Foundation also plans to work with the Des Moines Arts Commission to provide future artist designed enhancements.
