



Tips and Tricks for Recycling Plastic Items

Jou find plastics recycling Jonfusing, you're not alone. Because countless types of plastics exist, and not all plastics are collected in the curbside recycling cart, it's not always clear what goes where. But the good news is that recycling companies are working hard to make plastics recycling easier for the public by giving clearer guidelines and accepting more items. Here are a few handy tips:

GET IN SHAPE. If an item is marked with a number inside the "recycling arrows," that doesn't necessarily mean it's accepted by our recycling program. Instead of going by the number, go by the shape and the type of item. You can recycle all plastic bottles and tubs (such as yogurt and margarine tubs), so those are the main shapes you need to look for. The one exception is prescription pill vials. If you can't reuse those, you will need to throw them away.

HALF FULL OR HALF EMPTY?

Besides regular plastic bottles and tubs, plastic cups are accepted for curbside collection. After hosting a dinner party or a get together with friends, if you can't use reusable cups, go ahead and recycle your plastic cups in your recycling bin.

BAG YOUR BAGS. The best way to recycle your plastic bags and film is to bring them back to the grocery store. Just stuff them into a single plastic bag, tie it up and drop it into a plastic bag collection container. Plastic bags and film collected at grocery stores stay cleaner and are easier to process than using your home recycling bin.

BE WATER WISE. Using five gallons of water to wash out a food container doesn't make sense. Rinsing them with a little water is fine, or use a spatula to scrape stuff out. Containers don't have to be perfectly clean to go in the recycling, but you don't want to leave gobs of food in them either. If a container is very difficult to clean, feel free to just put that one in the garbage. And if it's a plastic container that contained a toxic chemical or motor oil, put it in the garbage, not the recycling.

REUSE FIRST. If you can reuse bags and other plastic items, that's always the best way to go.

Proposition To Fund City Street Pavement Overlays Will Go to Des Moines Voters August 6th

The Des Moines City Council and staff have been working hard to upgrade the City's infrastructure and to update its development policies to provide opportunities for economic growth and community prosperity even during these financially difficult economic times. The City Council believes that protecting and preserving our streets from further deterioration is important to maintain the quality of life for our citizens.

The City's street pavement overlay program is many years behind schedule and requires \$1.4 million per year to keep the pavement condition on the City street system in acceptable condition and minimize its overall life cycle costs.

At the August 6, 2013 Primary Election, the City of Des Moines will ask voters to decide whether to increase utility occupation tax from 6% to 8%, for a limited term of 20 years, to provide funding for City street pavement overlays and restoration. Funds from the additional 2% would be specifically



dedicated to overlay and repair the pavement on existing City streets.


These funds are needed because the funding source that the City traditionally uses to pay for capital projects—Real Estate Excise Taxes—has declined significantly because of the national recession and the associated reduction in property values.

The City's street pavement overlay program is many years behind schedule and requires \$1.4 million per year to keep the pavement condition on the City street system in acceptable condition and minimize its overall life cycle costs.

The City is responsible for a street system consisting of 100 centerline miles and approximately 215 lane miles of pavement.

The proposed 2% Utility
Occupation Tax increase would provide about 3/4 of the annual funding needed to support the City's pavement management program. Individual projects would be identified based on pavement condition and the optimum time to minimize overall street system preservation, reactive maintenance and rehabilitation costs. The City would strive to:

- maintain geographic balance in the program so that all parts of the City would benefit,
- 2. group projects so that contracting efficiencies and economies of scale would be achieved,
- 3. minimize disruptions to the community when work occurs and
- 4 coordinate work with other utilities. If approved, the City estimates this additional 2% utility tax would cost a typical family of four about \$10.00 per month. Additional information will be furnished on this ballot measure prior to the election and on the City's website at www.desmoineswa.gov.

Des Moines Police Medication Disposal Event April 27th

The Des Moines Police Department has again partnered with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and will be hosting two National Take-Back Initiative collection sites in the City of Des Moines to collect unused or expired prescriptions and over the counter solid medications for safe disposal, with no questions asked. This is a great opportunity for those who missed the previous events, or who have subsequently accumulated unwanted, unused prescription drugs, to safely dispose of those medications.

The rate of prescription abuse in the U.S. is increasing at alarming rates, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Fish in Des Moines Creek


T n January, devoted volunteers of the Des Moines Chapter of Trout Unlimited stocked Des Moines Creek with nearly 40,000 Coho salmon fish fry (juvenile fish) at several different locations along the creek. "This is something Trout Unlimited has been doing each year for at least the last 20 years," said volunteer Stephanie Mowery. Each year, eggs that are provided by the Soos Creek Fish Hatchery are carefully reared by Trout Unlimited at the Southwest Suburban Sewer District Plant Hatchery until the fish are ready to be released into Walker, Miller and Des Moines Creeks. Their mission is to restore selfsustaining runs of salmon to all of the local streams in the area. "We are doing this for the next generation," said Mike Grayson, another volunteer.

This incredible work by the volunteers is finally paying off. Usually around mid-November when the fish run starts, more than 250 fish have been returning to Des Moines Creek, with some fish reaching the upper reaches of the creek located in SeaTac at South 200th Street. This is also exciting news for the coalition of jurisdictions that make up the Des Moines Creek Basin Committee. Over the last several years, the Committee which includes the cities of SeaTac and Des Moines, Port of Seattle, Washington State Department of Transportation and King

County, has been making great strides in restoring Des Moines Creek. They have removed fish barriers, constructed a major storm water detention facility and creek bypass to control the erosive peak storm flows and installed fish habitat features which include bank logs, tree stumps and fish complexes along the creek as well as replacing gravel upstream that over the years washed into the lower reaches in Des Moines Beach Park. With the Des Moines Creek trail alongside the creek, trail users now have the opportunity to observe the fish runs that happen each year along with the glorious fall colors!



Des Moines Transportation Gateway Project Update

Construction of the Transportation
Gateway Project has begun. In February,
the contractor, SCI Infrastructure, started
construction on South 216th Street
between 18th Avenue and 24th Avenue
South. Work has started on the north
side of South 216th Street in the vicinity
of the Post Office. A new 12" water main
will be installed at the 24th Avenue S
intersection on behalf of the Highline
Water District. Upon completion of major
intersection work, traffic will be shifted
over to allow completion of work on the
south side of the street.

A "Greenroads" approach to design and construction was chosen by the City, the contractor and construction engineers in an attempt to minimize construction impacts on the community and utilize environmentally sustainable building techniques. It is expected hat the City, the contractor and the project engineers will seek Greenroads certification of this project (Similar to LEED building certification - see the project web site for more information). Still, this is major roadwork and impacts such as heavy equipment noise and traffic delays cannot be fully avoided.

Utility relocation and construction on 24th Avenue South between South 216th Street to South 208th Street will begin this spring and by 2014 the city expects improvements to both streets fronting the vacant Des Moines Creek Business Park (DMCBP), owned by the Port of Seattle. These improvements provide urban infrastructure needed to support development in the North Central and Pacific Ridge communities.

Funds for these two corridor improvements are from the Federal Highways Administration, the Washington State Transportation Improvement Board, Port of Seattle, Highline Water District, Midway Sewer District, King County Metro and the City of Des Moines. Simultaneously, the City of SeaTac is completing design of the





24th/28th Avenue South connection and expects to complete their improvements by 2016 in time for the opening of the Sound Transit Link light rail extension to South 200th Street.

The last phase of the Transportation Gateway Project, South 216th Street between 24th Avenue South and 29th Avenue South has been designed and the City is seeking funding for the right-of-way and construction phases of the project. When finished, the City will have developed "complete streets" along these three contiguous arterials supporting planned economic and urban development. New pedestrian bus shelters and roadway LED lighting along with art work, wide sidewalks, landscape planters, bike lanes and street furniture, will create a sustainable street environment that is conducive for walking, bicycling and driving.

These energy-saving upgrades will allow the pool



district to save an estimated \$15,000 annually in natural gas and electricity costs. Additionally, we've patched leaks in the pool, replaced the pool's circulation pump and starting blocks; repaired broken windows; repaired broken sidewalks and parking lot paving; re-striped the parking lot; replaced rusted-out lockers and hair dryers; and replaced building signage.

Since assuming responsibility for the pool, we have maintained the same quality swim lesson program and are dedicated to assuring that every child within the district have the opportunity to learn to swim. Water aerobics, lap swimming and pool rentals remain among the services we offer the community.


