



Lodging Tax Advisory Committee Members Sought

The City of Des Moines partners with Seattle Southside Tourism Promotion Area through an Interlocal Agreement with the Cities of SeaTac and Tukwila to promote Des Moines as a tourism destination for the economic benefit of our local businesses and the greater South Seattle area. In 2006, the City passed Ordinance No. 1319 to create a Lodging Tax Advisory Committee indentified in RCW 67.28.1817 whose purpose is to recommend to Des Moines City Council how best to spend the City's Hotel/Motel Tax collections. The Tax collects about \$20,000 annually and is expected to grow when the new Sheraton Four Points Hotel opens. All funds must be spent on tourism activities and promotion.

The Lodging Tax Advisory Committee has three openings to be filled in 2015; one position is available for a representative of the Hotel/Motel industry and two positions are open for representatives of the Tourism industry. The Committee will meet as needed, at least one time annually.

Study of Medicare Wellness & Disease Prevention

The goal of the project is to show that regular exercise for seniors improves wellness and disease prevention and to support Medicare reimbursements for such exercise programs around the U.S. All participant information is confidential and privacy is insured.

The Des Moines Activity Center Enhance Fitness classes are held on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, at either 8am or 9:30am. Classes are one hour, and held at the Des Moines Field House.

PERSONAL SAFETY: Know your surroundings and stay alert.

Over the past month, the Des Moines Police Department has investigated several attempted luring incidents near the Mount Rainier High School Campus. These incidents have included strange vehicles following young females walking to and from school to suspects

attempting to talk unsuspecting females into areas that are dark and hidden. We as an agency are working with local schools and our community to increase awareness and create a safer environment. As the Des Moines Police Department works to identify the suspect(s) in these cases we'd like to take the time to share tips on personal safety that families should consider as they discuss the importance of personal safety with their loved ones. Although the victims in these incidents have been young women in our community, everyone must take precautions to keep themselves safe. All of us should remember that we live in an era where human sex trafficking exists. Personal safety tips to practice and discuss with your family:

- Always know where you are!
 What street and cross street, or
 simply provide the description of a
 landmark. We'll get to you.
- Avoid walking alone. Find a friend that walks the same route and plan on walking together to and/or from school or events.
- Limit distractions (cell phones, iPods, etc.) and be alert to whom and what is going on around you at all times.
- Walk with purpose; project a confident image; keep your head up, look around and make eye contact.
- Use highly traveled routes
 rather than a shortcut. Shortcuts
 through forested areas or areas
 of restricted visibility increase risk
 and should be avoided if possible.
- When possible arrange transportation with a family member or friend, especially during hours of darkness.
- If you sense danger, quickly move towards a more populated area.
- Don't be afraid to approach a business or residence for help.
- It's ok to yell. Making a scene will often alert citizens to call 911.
- If you have a cell phone, call
 911 and tell the dispatcher that you're walking home or to school, and that someone is following you.
- Be focused on your environment, do not be distracted by personal electronics or so involved in your phone conversation that you are not aware of potential hazards in the area.
- Dress in clothing that does not hamper your movement and shoes that have good traction.
- Carry a noise making device and activate it if you feel threatened.



Get Fido Ready for the Outdoors

Springtime brings warm, sunny weather, budding trees and blooming flowers, and many fun outdoor activities for us and our dogs! Those of us who enjoy getting out and about with our canine companions certainly welcome the coming of spring, with its more comfortable temperatures and longer daylight hours.

One of the (many) great things about our dogs is that they keep us accountable for our fitness! It is important to work back into our outdoor activity slowly and steadily, both for us and for our dogs- they can get injured from being a "weekend warrior" just like we can! Making sure our dogs are at proper weight and condition, and being mindful of any prior illnesses, injuries, or special physical needs they have, are important aspects of having a productive and enjoyable fitness routine. It is a good idea to have a thorough veterinary exam if that has not been recently done, including appropriate vaccines, parasite control, and anything else deemed necessary by vet staff.

Getting our dogs out in public frequently includes seeing other dog owners out with their dogs too. It is important to be respectful of whether the other person and dog want to stop and visit, as some folks do not want their dog to be approached by other dogs, plus some people who are doing a "power walk" may have a fitness goal in mind and want to keep in motion!

Please remember that not all dogs like all other dogs- do you like every person you meet? Probably not, dogs are the same way, and often dogs that are large and rambunctious can be

upsetting to a smaller dog or a calmer, older dog. Basic Obedience/Good Manners training is especially important when we take our dogs out in publichaving them walk nicely on a leash, sit and stay when told, and not jump on or lunge at others is imperative.

We have fun, educational Basic Obedience/Good Manners classes at the Des Moines Fieldhouse through our Park and Recreation Department-our upcoming session begins March 5, and the following session begins on April 9. 

Housing Repair Assistance Program

The City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes.

SERVICES PROVIDED INCLUDE:

- Electrical faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans
- Plumbing faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters
- Disability Aids installation of grab bars, handrails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces
- Safety installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms & locksets
- Other faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes


HOW DO I QUALIFY FOR THESE FREE SERVICES?

- Be an owner/occupant within the
 Des Moines city limits for at least
 one year with no intention of selling
 in the next 12 months and have
 proof of home owner's insurance
- 2. Complete the application process

HOW DO I APPLY?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

- 1. Request an application by calling 206-870-6535
- 2. Complete the application forms and return them with the supporting documentation to the City of Des Moines/Minor Home Repair at 21630 11th Ave. S. Ste. D, Des Moines WA 98198
- 3. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.



Household Maintenance Best Practices Prevent Illicit Discharge

It's important to maintain your home, landscapes and cars. Done properly, you can prevent illicit discharges. Here are some tips to keep it green while you clean:

- Take your car to a car wash or wash it on the lawn so wash water drains to a landscaped area. (Avoid parking over drinking wells or septic systems.)
- If pressure washing, use the lowest setting and aim the wash water to a landscaped area. When possible, avoid using cleaning products and sweep/rake up paint chips to prevent them from entering stormdrains.
- Sweep sidewalks and driveways instead of using pressure washers (place swept up debris in garbage), or aim the wash water to a landscaped area.
- When cleaning carpets, filter and flush dirty water (if on sewer) or filter and spread over landscaped area if you are on a septic system (dirty wash water and cleaning agents can harm your septic system). If you are having your carpets professionally cleaned, ask the company about their wash water disposal policy first.
- Dispose of yard waste in a compost bin, yard waste bin or at a collection facility.
 Never dispose of yard waste in drainage ditches or stormwater ponds, as they interfere with the function of these stormwater facilities.

New Tree Regulations in Effect

After a yearlong process and extensive work by all of those involved, the City Council adopted a new "Trees" chapter to the Des Moines Municipal Code (DMMC) on November 13, 2014. Staff has prepared a Public Assistance Memo, or PAM, to inform property owners and contractors of the general requirements regarding the cutting, pruning and removal of trees on public and private property. The PAM can be found on the City's website at: www.desmoineswa.gov/landuse. The PAM should not be used as a substitute for codes and regulations. 




