Community members participate in the City's Comprehensive Plan outreach during National Night Out 2023



ublic participation in the City of Des Moines Comprehensive Plan Update survey was a success. The community survey on the Comprehensive Plan Update garnered the most responses of any survey conducted by the City in recent years. Thank you to the Des Moines community for enthusiastic participation in this effort!

The survey was open from July 27, 2023 to December 4, 2023 with 482 responses recorded, more than doubling the survey responses from the last Comprehensive Plan update survey. Public outreach included promotion through social media and online at the City's website. In-person outreach was also conducted at the Farmers Market and National Night Out. Questions in the survey sought to identify community priority areas to address in the Comprehensive Plan update.

Results found that priority areas respondents would like to see more of include neighborhood commercial uses, community facilities, and general commercial uses. The City's focus on equity, outreach, and representation of community members in the update was echoed by the respondents. Survey results also identified the top five topics respondents felt were important for the city to address, in order of priority:

	Preserving natural space
(4)	Public health and safety
	Accomodating future growth
	Affordability (housing, taxes, etc.)
(H)	Economic opportunity(including access to jobs)

Public outreach and participation in surveys provide invaluable input into the priority areas for community planning. The feedback from this survey will be utilized in the update of the City of Des Moines Comprehensive Plan.

ur dedicated Engineering Services Team is making waves with their up and coming projects that will enhance our community's infrastructure.

Currently, the team is working on three major developments. The Marina Steps project, a testament to our commitment to recreational spaces, is set to provide a picturesque pathway to the waterfront, inviting residents and visitors alike to experience the scenic beauty of our marina. At the same time, the restoration of the Redondo Fishing Pier is underway, promising to preserve a beloved landmark while modernizing it for future generations to enjoy. Lastly, the Arterial Paving project, which will repair key sections of arterial roads around the City is expected to begin this summer. This aims to contribute to the ongoing efforts to maintain and enhance the accessibility of our roads.

Housing Repair Assistance Program

he City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County. Services provided include but are not limited to:

Electrical – faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans

Plumbing – faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters

Disability Aids – installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces

Safety – installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets

Other – faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

How do I qualify for these free services?

- Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months, have proof of home owner's insurance, and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program.
- 2. Complete the application process

How do I apply?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

- Request an application by email at thickey@ desmoineswa.gov or by calling (206) 870-6535
- 2. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/ or safety are the highest priority.




