



From the Chief of Police

t is an honor to be entrusted to lead the Des Moines **Police Department.** In my short time as your chief, it is clear that you have a very special police department serving Des Moines. The men and women on the front lines in uniform and the civilian employees supporting them are driven by an exceptional sense of service to our community. Currently your police department consists of 19 patrol officers, 5 detectives, 7 sergeants, 2 court security marshals, 6 records custodians, 1 community service officer, 1 evidence technician, 1 code enforcement officer and 1 mental health co-responder. Collectively, they respond to nearly 19,000 calls for service from our community every year.

As a department, we will commit to three guiding principles for our work, keeping all of them in balance and recognizing that all three are a requirement to do this job well:

Fighting Crime; We will fight crime proactively and reactively by addressing all criminal behaviors in our community and by always doing our jobs to the best of our ability.

Building Trust; We will work hard to find a way to "yes." We will appreciate that policing is a team sport requiring involvement from all of our community and we will commit to professional interactions internally and with all our customers.

Supporting Each Other; We recognize that being healthy is a balance of financial, mental, spiritual, physical and relational health. In order to serve others well, we need to prioritize the health of our staff.

In future issues of City Currents, I will discuss crime trends, crime prevention techniques, how we are engaging our community and where you can participate in shaping your police department today and in the future. Thank you again for your trust and warm welcome to the city of Des Moines.



Comprehensive Plan and Housing Updates



■ he City of Des Moines continues to make strides in completing the periodic update to the Comprehensive Plan, which is required every ten years in accordance with the state's Growth Management Act.

Recently, the King County Affordable Housing Committee reviewed the draft Housing Element of the Plan and praised much of the work and policy development that has taken place, stemming from the efforts to produce and adopt a Housing Action Plan. The Committee also pointed

out some opportunities for the City to further align the draft with the County wide Planning Policies document.

Next, the City has contracted with the firm Fehr & Peers to perform the work necessary to update the Transportation Element of the Plan.

special thank you to those who joined us for the Middle Housing Public Open House on January 15! We appreciate these conversations and feedback as we work towards developing middle housing regulations for Des Moines.

Middle housing is defined as buildings that are compatible in scale, form, and character with singlefamily houses and contain two or more dwelling units. Middle housing types can include duplexes, townhouses, cottage housing, and others. The purpose is to create more homes for Washington by increasing middle housing in areas traditionally dedicated to single-family detached housing.

♦ he City of Des Moines is working on implementing new House Bill EHB 1337 - Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) in addition to Middle Housing Bill HB 1110. The purpose of HB 1337 is to expand housing options by easing barriers to the construction and use of ADUs.

An ADU is a dwelling unit situated on the same lot as a singlefamily home, duplex, triplex, townhome, or other housing unit. ADUs are referred to by various other names, including mother-inlaw suites, backyard cottages, attached accessory dwelling units (AADUs), and detached accessory dwelling units (DADUs).

It is required by state law that cities and counties in Washington State update their ADU and Middle Housing regulations to comply with HB 1110 and HB 1337 by June 2025.

What is Block Watch?

Block Watch is a neighborhood program comprised of a group of people living in the same area who want to make their neighborhood safer by working together and in conjunction with law enforcement to reduce crime and improve their quality of life.

Why start a Block Watch?

Block Watch allows neighbors to look out for each other and keep an eye on their surroundings, which can help reduce crime in the area. It also, provides an opportunity for members of the community to come together and build relationships with one another.

The benefits of setting up a Block Watch are numerous: increased security, neighborhood camaraderie, improved communication between neighbors, and more:

- 1. Deter Crime: The presence of active and engaged residents who are vigilant and observant can make criminals think twice before targeting an area. With more people looking out for each other, suspicious activity or criminal behavior is more likely to be reported.
- 2. Improved Relationships: Block Watch encourages residents to work together for a common goal - the safety of their community. This can foster a sense of unity and trust among neighbors. Block Watch provide an opportunity to get to know the people around you—your neighbors.
- 3. More Awareness: Members of a neighborhood watch tend to be more aware of their surroundings. They are likelier to notice suspicious activities or individuals and report them to law enforcement. It also encourages people to be more vigilant in their daily lives and stay aware of their surroundings, making the community safer as a whole.

One of the key benefits of setting up a Block Watch in your community is the peace of mind that comes from knowing that your neighbors are looking out for you and your family.

New Car Share Debuts at the Marina

es Moines is the beneficiary of a new electric care share service thanks to a Washington State
Department of Commerce clean energy grant won by local nonprofit ZEV co-op.

Located immediately behind the Harbormaster's office in the Des Moines Marina, the car share is open to any body who registers online at zev.coop/membership.

Des Moines Mayor Traci Buxton formally cut the ribbon on the new car share in late January, noting that it is the first of several new electric mobility initiatives to be introduced at the marina over the next several months.

"Des Moines is positioning ourselves as a leader in regional clean energy initiatives. Through grant-funded programs like this, we are preparing our community for the next generation of mobility, including; electric car shares, public charging stations, and electric passenger-only ferry service."

The ZEV co-op initiative is the first in a series of grant funded projects planned for the marina, including a public electric vehicle charging station at the northern end of the marina which will be designed in such a way as to support future electric passenger ferries as well as shoreside vehicles and transit.

Minor Home Repair Services

he City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County.

Services provided include, but are not limited to:

- Electrical faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans
- Plumbing faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters
- Disability Aids installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces
- Safety-installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets
- Other faulty furnaces, faulty gutters, and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

How do I apply?

How do I qualify for these free services?

- 1. Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines City limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months.
- 2. Have proof of home owner insurance and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program
- 3. Complete the application process




