From the Mayor

Our city is at a crossroad, and it is time we talk, frankly about the Marina and its development.

The direction we take today will determine the future of Des Moines, now and for years to come. As a reminder, your City staff and Council majority have worked hard to put our City in solid fiscal shape with a good credit rating to accomplish this task. We have the means to finance such an endeavor in a prudent and frugal manner. The City is well positioned to undertake the Marina redevelopment and gain the subsequent economic benefits, municipal amenities, and excellent opportunities that redevelopment will bring. If we choose the right path, we can ascertain a great future.

I see four directions we can go. The first is to turn back, keep everything the same, stay a small sleepy town and continue to wonder why we never realized our potential. We can continue to ask for a grocery store, ponder why empty lots remain undeveloped and why some store fronts and buildings continue to make us look like 1962.

Direction two. We can take a left and do the same thing we have done since 1984. We can have more public forums, community development groups and red tape and bureaucracy that come with such a choice. We can talk, debate and argue back and forth about the same components and their locations as we have done time and time again. Groups will pick the same components, steps, hotels, retail space, restaurants, etc. Our City will continue to push back the future along with the City's potential. We will try to appease the Nimbyism and fail to make everyone happy. Our opportunity to move forward will fall to the wayside. We will build nothing, do nothing, and wonder why we have done nothing.

Direction three. We could turn right and force development in our downtown. We can try to use code enforcement to force privately owned property owners to improve their properties, fine them or force them to sell. We can try to dictate

development in downtown and even on the outskirts. These are privately owned properties, not City owned properties! The City can, and will work with property owners on what types of building they want to build, and what type of businesses they want to bring to Des Moines, but other than code requirements and possible violations the City cannot step over property owner's rights. And should we go this route, then I say good luck because the last time I checked, property rights are a right that we should, and are, required to honor. I wonder how many homeowners would appreciate being told what they can and cannot do with their own property outside the allowable code. I am quite sure we, along with investors and developers we need here, would all balk at such a request and they would go elsewhere. While enforcing code has validity in some capacity and can help to a small degree,

to think we can pressure development to the extent some have suggested is unwise, undoable, and irresponsible.

Direction four. The City can move forward. Use information that we have obtained over the past 39 years and actually "build it." We can add a great space in our Marina that all our residents can enjoy. A space with switchbacks and steps, water features, points of vantage and beautiful landscaping. We can add amenities and economic generators by the addition of a restaurant or two, a splash pad for kids, a ferry system, a walkable path with useful features that connect the Marina to downtown, and add opportunity for some retail along with a new open space we can all be proud of. We can continue to consider a public/private partnership for a hotel, someday in the future, against the cliff side (not in

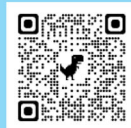

the north parking lot), bringing visitors and their dollars to our community. By doing this we would create economic generators for our businesses downtown and create demand for more buildings and businesses. We can ensure that the Marina supports itself through additional moorage opportunities and fuel sales, by adding an Adaptive Purpose Building that will allow for a dry stack storage facility employing green energy to ensure quiet and environmentally responsible operations. We can add a space for our SR3 organization that cares for sea creatures such as baby seals, which could allow for visitation that would not interfere with their care. These changes will bring visitors to our town, who will eat in our restaurants and shop in our shops. We can add bigger boats, but still serve smaller boats, while increasing revenue to ensure the longevity of Marina operations without privatization. Most importantly, we can increase the desire for people to live and visit here, protect the value of our homes and properties throughout Des Moines, and bring interest and development

to our downtown. Development and investment in our town are triggered by generating economic opportunities. By adding amenities at the Marina and along 223rd we will accomplish such. To get a grocery stores, new businesses or new buildings you need density, and you need demand. These are the factors that will really change this community for what we all desire. This is the direction at the crossroads we have talked about but have never taken.

We can do this Des Moines and we can move our city forward, but we also can do this and keep our small-town charm. Many cities who are blessed with waterfront have done this repeatedly, Point Ruston, Kirkland, Mukilteo, Ballard, Carillon Point, and Edmonds to name a few.

We have been given a great gift of a waterfront like no other. We can do wonderful things, and everyone can win. We can make a great space for all Des Moianians to enjoy. We simply must be brave and choose the direction straight forward at the crossroads!!

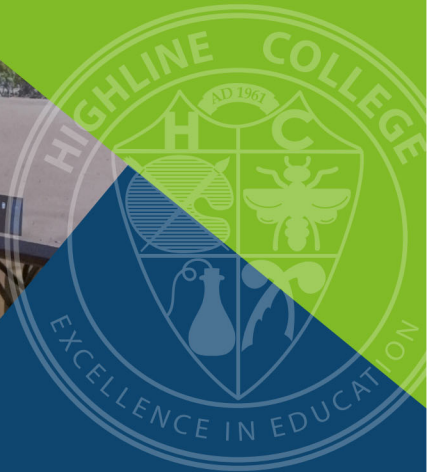

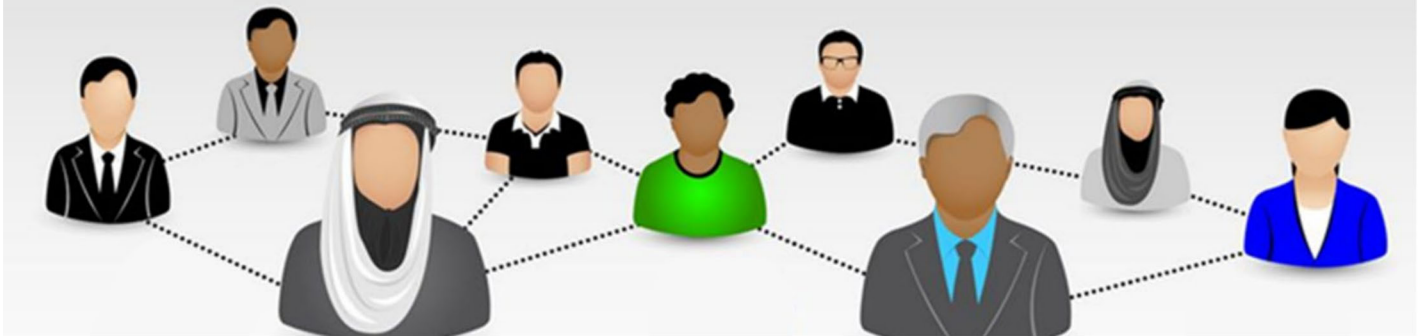

Des Moines Marina North Bulkhead & Restroom Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

On March 1, Des Moines City leaders celebrated the completion of the North Bulkhead & Restroom Replacement Project with a ribbon cutting ceremony.

Mayor Matt Mahoney, City Manager Michael Matthias and Public Works Director Andrew Merges spoke to the audience and expressed their gratitude to the elected officials, Project Team, City staff and to the community for their patience and continued support for the project.

The completion of the project removed and replaced a breakwater, a public restroom structure and 900 feet of Marina North bulkheads that were in poor condition and needed to be replaced. The project also provides a safe and welcoming public space with improved pedestrian facilities, landscape amenities and urban design features.

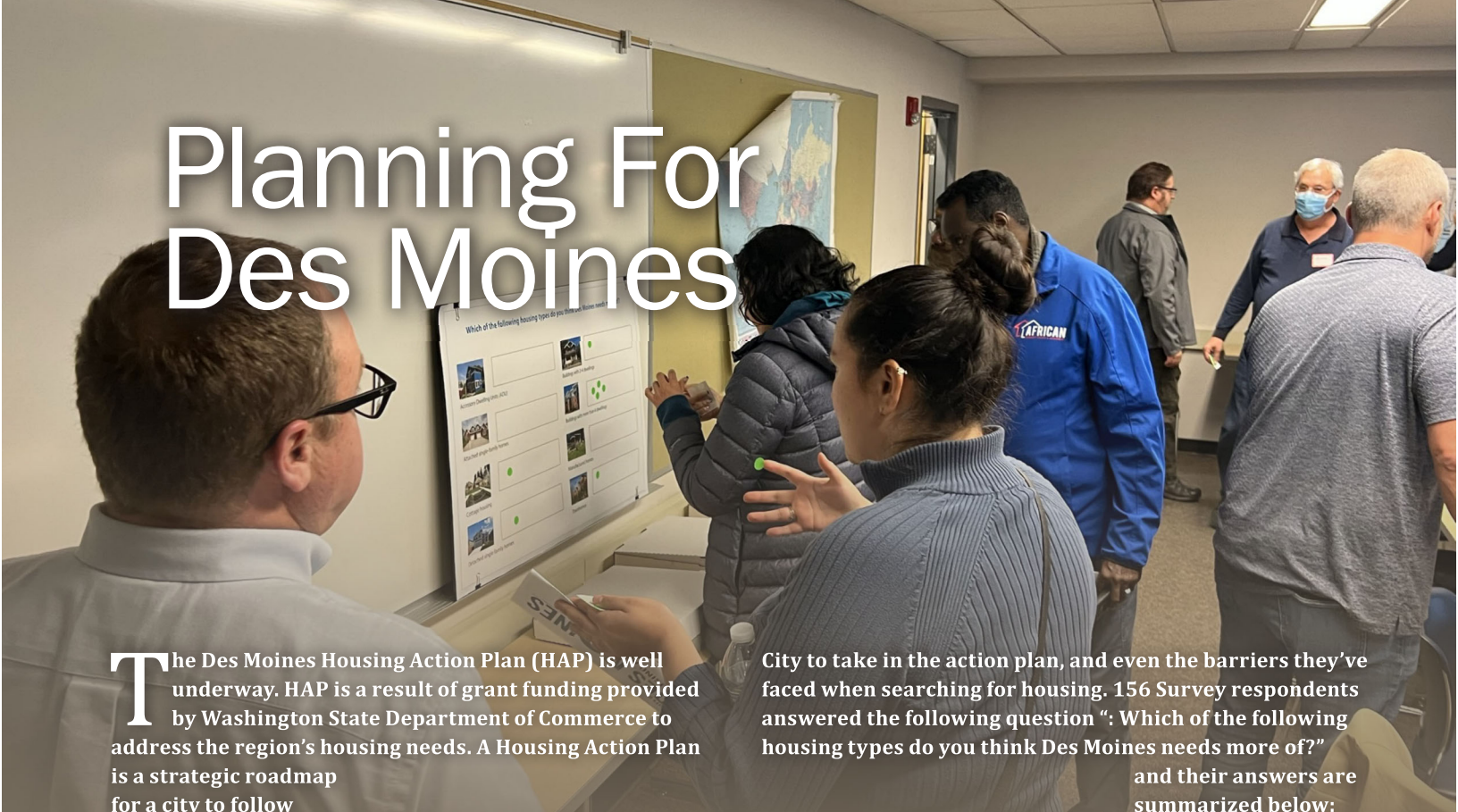

Planning For Des Moines



The Des Moines Housing Action Plan (HAP) is well underway. HAP is a result of grant funding provided by Washington State Department of Commerce to address the region’s housing needs. A Housing Action Plan is a strategic roadmap for a city to follow toward furthering its housing goals and ensuring an equitable approach for acquiring and retaining one’s housing.

Public Participation for HAP has been a success. We’ve staffed two open houses events at Highline College, tabled at the local library, shared information on our websites and social media, and have held stakeholder interviews including interviews with local non-profits and service providers. We saw community members, stakeholders, and several council members in attendance at our open houses. An outreach event was held at the Des Moines Food Bank on March 8th in order to expand our reach and include feedback from additional residents who may benefit most from the outcomes of this plan.

A survey that was open from November 15, 2022 through January 31, 2023 received 206 responses. 93% of respondents reported living within the City of Des Moines. The responses have informed what kinds of housing types the community wishes to see, the actions they would like the

City to take in the action plan, and even the barriers they’ve faced when searching for housing. 156 Survey respondents answered the following question “: Which of the following housing types do you think Des Moines needs more of?”

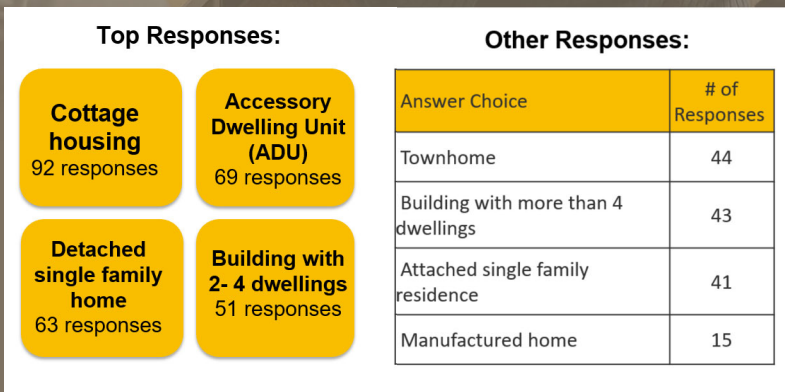
and their answers are summarized below:

Ultimately the HAP will inform housing goals, policies and strategies in the Des Moines Comprehensive Plan. Planning staff and AHBL, our consultant, are beginning to kick-off the Comprehensive Plan Update. This effort is also funded by a grant from the Department of

Commerce and will need to be complete by the end of 2024.
