Two New Members Join Des Moines City Council

On January 7th, Melissa Musser and Matt Pina were sworn in as Des Moines City Council members, as were re-elected members Carmen Scott and Dave Kaplan. They joined current Councilmembers Scott Thomasson, Bob Sheckler and Dan Sherman. Following the swearing-in ceremony, Council elected Bob Sheckler to his third term as mayor and Dave Kaplan mayor pro tem.

Councilmember Musser and her husband Brian have been married and lived in the same house on North Hill for 17 years. They have a daughter, who is a freshman at Mt. Rainier High School, and a son, who is a 4th grader at North Hill. When asked why she ran for City Council, Melissa states, "I ran for the Council amidst the rumors of park and pool closures. I'm a huge supporter of programs for the youth of our city, so I ran in an effort to represent the families with young kids in our schools. As a council member I hope to facilitate an increased level of cooperation between the council members and accomplish visible goals for our residents".

Councilmember Pina has lived in the Des Moines community the majority of his life. He and his wife of 27 years met at Pacific Middle School and graduated from Mt. Rainier High School. Their son also graduated from Mt. Rainier High School and is now attending Central Washington University. Matt states, "I ran for Des Moines City Council because I felt that my background in Business, Finance and Technology would complement the Council. Additionally with a focus on working together, I believe we can generate the partnerships with the public, business owners, staff and interested developers to help address the budgetary issues that Des Moines is facing". He further states that his top priorities are public safety, financial stability, community partnerships and quality of life.

New Pirate Ship at Des Moines Field House Park Play Area Now Open

The new Field House play area is now open and ready for family fun just in time for spring! The City of Des Moines wishes to recognize the Rotary Club of Des Moines for its contribution of \$10,000 in support of this much awaited community asset.



Watch for the grand reopening of the Historic Field House Park Grandstand and Ballfield #1 in spring 2011. The Grandstand, a community icon, was closed due to unsafe conditions in 2008 and will be restored to its former glory following the Secretary of the Interior's standards for historic rehabilitation. The Ballfield #1 outfield will be expanded to allow for 90 ft. bases and improved play and safety.

Improvements to South 216th Street Begin in April

(Marine View Drive to 11th Avenue South)

South 216th Street will be widened along this corridor beginning in April to provide a two-way left turn lane, curbs, gutter, and sidewalks along both sides of the street, and bicycle lanes in each direction. Utilities will be placed underground as part of this project. The contractor will have 180 working days to complete the work. The project was partially funded through a grant received from the King County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and frontage improvement in-lieu fees provided by the Wesley Homes Retirement Center. Major Construction at the Marina – Watch Your Step

IMCO General Construction is quickly moving forward with construction of the new steel sheet pile bulkhead, underground utility upgrades and other related projects.

Marina walkers will find a temporary pedestrian footpath along the east side of Dock Ave. S. A portion of Dock Ave. S. remains closed to vehicle traffic, but the fishing pier may be accessed from the Marina's north entrance at S. 223rd and Cliff Avenue and the remainder of the Marina from the south entrance at S. 227th Street. Boaters are still able to enjoy the beauty of the Des Moines Marina with just a few ongoing changes involving access to M, N and Guest Moorage docks. Whether walking, boating or just driving in to view the scenery, please continue to enjoy the Marina, but exercise caution knowing that major construction is in progress!




City Council Adopts 2010 Budget

The Des Moines City Council adopted the 2010 operating and capital budgets on December 10, 2009. The 2010 operating and capital budgets included expenditures of \$28.2 million and \$18.4 million, respectively, with overall spending totaling \$46.6 million.

The General and Street Funds are the City's general governmental funds and include the expenditures for general administration, court and jail, police services, public works administration, transportation engineering, road and street maintenance, building permitting services, development services, long-range planning, parks administration, parks and facilities maintenance, recreation programs, human services, senior programs and services.

The 2010 budget process focused primarily on achieving balanced budgets for the General and Street Funds. This process was impacted by the continued economic downturn that began in the fourth quarter of 2008. Even though City leaders addressed the revenue declines with significant budget cuts during the first half of 2009, the City still realized a budget gap of approximately \$1.6 million for the 2010 base budget.


In early fall 2009 the Council started the process to balance the 2010 budget. The City Manager initially offered Council a number of revenue and expenditure options that, taken together, were greater than the budget deficit, including cutting all parks and recreation programs, two lobbyist contracts, three vacant police officer positions, two vacant community officer positions and a police records specialist; reducing the code enforcement officer to half time; reducing funding for equipment and computer replacements; and asking the voters to increase utility taxes. Council rejected the utility tax option, the wholesale elimination of parks and recreation, and the reduction of code enforcement services. Staff identified additional revenue in the form of unused library district property tax authority and revised sales tax projections. Even then additional expenditure cuts were needed. Given the deep cuts in other departments that were taken earlier in 2009, staff brought cuts in the recreation staff and the Police Department to the Council for consideration. Council ultimately adopted a balanced budget that included these additional cuts



Des Moines Creek Trail Update

The Des Moines Creek Trail project was put on hold due to wet site conditions in early January after completion of storm water improvements, rock walls, a soldier pile wall, and grading. Once the trail dries and the project resumes, the contractor will be working on final grading and asphalt paving along the trail as well as other improvements in Beach Park. Des Moines Transportation Gateway Project



The Transportation Gateway Project, involving design of improvements to S. 216th Street and 24th Avenue S., is progressing rapidly to support a landmark development initiative for the City. These roadways are being designed as "complete streets" with two additional travel lanes, turn lanes, bicycle lanes, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, and other urban design features. These improvements will be critical in providing the needed transportation capacity for the planned Des Moines Creek Business Park and the Pacific Ridge neighborhood.

In late 2009, the Des Moines City Council, following public meetings and input, directed staff to proceed with final design using an "offset" alignment that varies the roadway alignment to best preserve currently developed properties and avoid relocation of residents.

Final design focuses on 24th Avenue S. and two segments of S. 216th Street: Segment 1A – 29th Avenue S. to 24th Avenue S. including widening of the SR99 intersection; and Segment 2, 24th Avenue S. to 19th Avenue S. where it transitions to a future 3-lane road section. Design of 24th Avenue S. improvements, between S. 208th St. and S. 216th St., includes major changes to the S. 216th Street intersection. Further design of S. 216th Street east of 29th Avenue S. has been deferred to the long range plan pending uncertain extension SR-509 and replacement of the I-5 overpass.

This spring the City is working with the Port of Seattle and WSDOT to secure much of the required right-of-way and complete environmental reviews. Steps that follow include finalizing roadway design and drainage systems, wetland studies, right-of-way planning, appraisals and eventually property acquisition activities. Focus will be on getting 24th Avenue S. and/or S. 216th Street, Segment 2, ready for construction by 2011 if funds become available.

The City plans to send invitations to neighbors and property owners to attend a public open house this summer to discuss how the improvements will mesh with their properties. For more information or project updates, call 206-870-6525 or visit www.desmoineswa.gov/tgp.

The 2010 Census and Why Des Moines Residents Should Participate

The U.S. Census counts every resident in the United States and Puerto Rico. It is required by the U.S. Constitution and has been conducted every 10 years since 1790.

In March, every resident in Des Moines should have received a 2010 US Census form. Residents were asked to answer 10 short questions and mail the form back in the postage-paid envelope provided. Census forms that are not returned will necessitate a visit from a census taker who will ask the questions from the form. It costs substantially more money to send census takers to households that fail to mail back their form than it does to receive it by mail. Every 1% increase in the national mail back participation rate for the 2010 Census saves \$85 million in taxpayer money!

Your participation in the 2010 Census is important to ensure our community receives its fair share of political representation and government funding. Census counts are used to determine congressional, state and local voting districts. Data is also used in analyzing local population and income trends, assess fairness of employment practices, monitor racial disparities, scientific research, prevent diseases, research markets and more.

Accurate data reflecting changes in our community is crucial in deciding how more than \$400 billion in federal funds is allocated each year for things like public health, job training centers, schools, senior centers, public works projects and emergency services. The Census Bureau estimates the total federal funding amounts to \$1,400/ person/year.

Des Moines Planning Agency Update

Last fall, the City Council tasked the Planning Agency with the mission to work with City planning staff to create design guidelines for our downtown area. The goal is to fashion a document that blends a sense of public vision with concrete and easily understood guidelines for designers and developers as they evaluate, plan, and implement redevelopment projects in the downtown waterfront core. This document is but one part of an overall redevelopment strategy, but it is an important one since it will affect the pattern and the "look and feel" of the new environment we will see and experience in the future.

This effort builds upon several years of discussion within the City Council and represents its efforts to bring the widest possible array of stakeholders into the process. As part of the guidelines review, the Agency hosted a public open house on March 22nd to get the community's input on the draft *Marina District Design Guidelines*. The guidelines can be viewed on the City's website at: www.desmoineswa. gov/planning. In addition, the Agency has set up an email account and public comments are encouraged: planning_agency@desmoineswa.gov.

Development and Construction Emphasis Shifting in 2010

To maintain a vibrant community with a diverse social and broader economic make up, the City will be investing significant time and resources in 2010 to modify its codes, reconstruct key physical systems such as City facilities and infrastructure, and promote larger commercial development. This investment is being done with the intent of attracting the type of growth and development which will provide for new opportunities for Des Moines business owners and financial stability and improved services for its residents.

The City's Marina is a prime example of this type of activity shift. Recent construction, which completely upgrades the marina water and electrical systems, is done and construction is underway to replace the 40 year old harbor seawall. Similar investments and upgrades are occurring in the City's Beach Park.

The City is also strategically targeting improvements and code changes in and around the Downtown and the Des Moines Creek Business Park — two areas that the City Council has ranked high on its strategic priority list. The water distribution system within Marine View Drive and associated side streets in the Downtown is poised for replacement, possibly this summer or fall. New design guidelines are also being crafted to shape new development in the Downtown. Parking requirements have been eased through 2010 and 2011 to spur developer interest in the Downtown. And, contingent upon award of final funding, the main east-west access to the central part of the Downtown (South 223rd Street) may also be partially reconstructed and resurfaced this year.

The City continues aggressively pursuing the initial phases of new development of the 89-acre Business Park site with the Port of Seattle. A possible development scenario that the City and Port are pursuing is the new regional headquarters for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) which seeks to construct approximately 518,000 square feet of new office space for its 2,000 employees.

SR-509 Right-of-Way Acquisition Proposed

The City of Des Moines hopes to acquire the historic State Route 509 right-of-way from the Washington State Department of Transportation to use for a 16th Ave. S. road extension, construction of a trail along Barnes Creek and potential storm water facilities for the Transportation Gateway Project. Deadlines for GMA Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations Review Extended 3 Years

Due to State budgetary constraints, SSB 6611 extends the Growth Management Act deadline for counties and cities planning to complete the review and update of their comprehensive plans and development regulations to 2014. State statute RCW 36.70A.130 requires counties and cities to periodically conduct a thorough review of their plan and regulations to bring them up to date with any relevant changes in the GMA, and to respond to changes in land use and population growth.

Why we plan...The comprehensive plan is the centerpiece of local planning in Washington State. Comprehensive plans express the values and priorities of our communities. Like business plans, they provide the framework for how our communities will grow – a roadmap for how our community wants to look and to function. Like business plans, they must evolve over time to be effective.

Like many jurisdictions, Des Moines conducts scheduled reviews of select plan elements on an annual basis. The last required periodic update for Des Moines was 2002, although changes were not adopted until March 2006. Over the next year or two, staff will be working with the community, Planning Agency and City Council to obtain input on this work. 



Resident Priority:

Effective January 1, 2010, the City of Des Moines implemented a Resident Discount Policy offering residents discounted fees for recreation programs. Non-residents and city residents who choose not to provide proof of residency will be assessed the full fee for programs.

The Resident Discount ("RD") Fee is available to residents living within the City of Des Moines' jurisdictional boundaries and Senior Adults. To qualify for the "RD" Fee participants must provide proof of residency such as. Valid picture ID with a Des Moines Address. Valid picture ID accompanied by a utility bill with their Des Moines Address. Sports Teams qualify for the "RD" Fee when 51% of their players are Des Moines residents (proof of Residency will be requested.) The full program fee will be charged to participants who are not Des Moines residents or choose not to provide proof of residency. Questions related to residency should be directed to 206-870-6527.
