




Charting Our Course for a Sustainable Future

The City of Des Moines is updating its Comprehensive Plan in accordance with the Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) governed by RCW 36.70A. Des Moines will take about one year to complete its review and update which is due to the state in June 2015. The update will include:

- A VISION of how we want to grow/develop over the next 20 years;
- · New estimates of population and job growth;
- More information about how the Plan relates to other City and regional plans/regulations;
- · New Economic Development Element;
- · A more clear, concise and accessible document.



Des Moines is expected to add 3,000 new housing units and 5,000 new jobs BY 2035. The Des Moines Comprehensive Plan serves as a roadmap that expresses our community's goals and aspirations for how we want to grow and prosper in the future. It is the City's official policy guide that defines—through goals, policies and implementation strategies—how Des Moines should best accommodate forecasted household and job growth, manage traffic, and provide open space and recreational opportunities and other vital services. The plan is "comprehensive" in both scope and coverage. It addresses the use of land and buildings, the movement of traffic and pedestrians, the provision of parks, schools, and public facilities, and protection of the environment. It addresses residential neighborhoods, commercial areas, public and institutional lands, and public rights-of-way. The plan provides a guide for public investments and capital improvements, and can help to ensure that local public dollars are spent wisely. Finally, the comprehensive plan can serve as a marketing tool to promote Des Moines's unique assets, and help to attract new families, businesses, investment and development to the community.



Public participation is a key component in the effort to update the Comprehensive Plan. Online Permitting in the Waterland City

PermitTrax, our new permitting software in the Planning, Building and Public Works Department, was introduced in August 2011. We have enjoyed many benefits from this updated software ever since! One of these began in April 2013 when we began to offer online permitting for some Residential permits that do not require plan review (reroof, electrical, plumbing and mechanical). These are permits that homeowners or properly licensed contractors could always apply for and receive immediately over-the-counter at the Community Development office at City Hall. Emails announced the new online opportunity to many of the contractors who stop in from time to time and the new system caught on quickly!

Contractors have become accustomed to securing permits online in many neighboring jurisdictions and they have really enjoyed how easy it is for them here. Applicants go to a page

on the City website (www.desmoineswa.gov/mypermits) and follow the directions there, paying with a Visa or MasterCard. To access this form, use the following address (www.desmoineswa.gov/mypermits) and follow directions for paying with a Visa or MasterCard. The application routes to the Permit Specialists, where they confirm applicant information, add proper inspections and (if approved) reply with a permit to the applicant. It is a very welcome process to contractors! No expense for travel, no hours spent on special trips to our offices just to get permits that cost as little as \$75.00.

Online permitting has been a very successful addition to the City's service offerings. Since the beginning, thirteen months ago, staff have issued 426 online permits. That's 29% of all permits issued for the same period of time. Imagine the gasoline expense saved, the pollution avoided, the hourly expense of permit runners saved and the amount of paper saved! We are very glad to be offering this new service to our customers!



Pacific Highway South Subarea Planning is Underway

In January 2014, Des Moines kicked off the Pacific Highway South Subarea Planning for the area around South 240th Street and Highline Community College (HCC), often referred to as "Midway." This work builds upon the Envision Midway project that was completed in the 2008-09 time frame and engaged a broad range of stakeholders to create a unified vision for the area that is bisected by an irregular boarder between the cities of Des Moines and Kent.

The subarea planning effort will establish the policy framework, land use and development standards to facilitate the transformation of the Midway area from a lower density, auto-oriented strip development to a mixed use employment/activity center that capitalizes on the opportunities provided by Highline Community College, Metro's RapidRide and Sound Transit's Link Extension investments. Initially, the City will be considering zoning changes that implement Envision Midway, and respond to immediate development opportunities. We are also taking a broader look at the subarea to identify additional opportunities to create new jobs, provide for housing choices and increase city revenues.


A public open house seeking community input was held at Highline Community College on March 26, 2014. Staff will continue to coordinate with stakeholders to finalize the subarea plan for the Midway area that includes: improving development regulations; creating overlay zones around future and potential light rail station areas; developing informative but not overly restrictive design guidelines; capital improvement plans; and funding strategies. Panattoni Development Company, Inc. to Break Ground on Phase I of the Des Moines Creek Business Park Summer 2014

The 89 acres of property located on 24th Avenue South between South 216th Street and South 208th Street, commonly referred to as the "Port Buy Out Area", has remained vacant since the mid-1990s following the removal of the homes that once occupied the area as part of a noise mitigation program for Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. Since 2005, the City and the Port have been working together to bring economic development to the City and the region through the development of the area which is now referred to as the Des Moines Creek Business Park (DMCBP).


In June 2013, the Port of Seattle announced that it had selected Panattoni Development Company, Inc. to develop the DMCBP. Des Moines City Council approved the Master Plan for Phases I and II of the three-phased development on February 20, 2014. The Port of Seattle is expected to approve the long term ground lease and development agreement with Panattoni in May 2014.

Phases I and II include five buildings containing up to one million square feet of flexible-use, manufacturing, office, distribution, and industrial business park uses able to accommodate tenants that desire immediate proximity to Sea-Tac Airport for their business. An economic impact analysis performed for the Port estimates 1,500 jobs and \$6.1 million in

Earthwork for Phase I will commence in early summer and will be coordinated with the improvements to 24th Avenue South currently under construction.

- **Water Quality and** Stream Health


The City is working on a future plan for management of your surface water facilities and would like your input! Please join the City at one of several public meetings.

WHAT HAS THE CITY DONE SO FAR?

The Surface Water Management Division has already reviewed data on the current surface water management program. conducted several surveys of City staff who work on managing surface water, and met with a City Council Committee. A draft list of potential surface water management projects and ranking criteria have been developed and we need your input!

HOW DO I FIT INTO THIS PROCESS?

The City would like to invite you to attend a public meeting in your drainage area to provide input on what is most important to you for future stormwater spending. For example, should we select projects first that reduce flooding or keep pollutants out of the water? Should the rainwater management projects all be selected based on the most extreme problems, even if that means there is no project in your neighborhood? These and other issues will be discussed at each meeting.



A VIEW FROM THE BENCH

HAVING SERVED AS MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE for the City of Des Moines for almost seven years, I have come to appreciate the importance that technology plays in the performance of my



duties. Whether serving in a large city or in a small rural town, judges are called upon daily to make difficult decisions that directly impact not only the lives of the people appearing before them, but also the lives of victims, families, and to a certain extent the community at large. In order to effectuate this task, judges are reliant upon information so they may render the best most informed decision possible. This need for information has made technology an essential tool in the arsenal of dispensing justice. Currently, our courts are facing a technological crisis as the statewide Judicial Information System (JIS) which they have relied upon, is being rendered obsolete by the technological advances we have seen over the last few decades. The current system used by our courts was created in 1981 and the language spoken by the system is no longer a standard

programming language in the technology industry.

The inability to use some of the newer technology to improve court efficiency has caused some courts, to go "off grid" and create their own case management systems whose information is primarily available at the local level. This has caused frustration with other courts, as information necessary to assist a judge in rendering a decision is hampered by the inability to fully access these local systems. The State of Washington has recognized the potential impact to public safety because we do not have a statewide case management system which is equally accessible by all courts. To this end, the State has provided funding for the completion of a statewide case management system for the Superior court level, and we are hopeful that funding will likewise be appropriated for a statewide case management system for the district and municipal courts that serve our citizens.

As incoming president of the District and Municipal Court Judges Association, one of my top priorities is to push forward with the creation and implementation of a statewide case management system for our court level. The Association is working with the Administrative Office of the Courts and other

stakeholders to ensure we have a product that works for all courts-large and small, urban and rural. This is not an easy task. There are approximately two hundred and seventy two district and municipal courts throughout our state and each has different needs and requirements that are unique to their situation. However, we must recognize that while we may differ philosophically on how to best run our individual courts, we all need as much information as possible in order to perform our function. As we move forward in our efforts to harness technology and its uses to help us become more informed and efficient courts, we must always be cognizant that we serve a justice system not a system for just us.

Avoid household maintenance practices that result in illicit discharge

It's important to maintain your home, landscapes and cars. Unfortunately, if done incorrectly, some of these maintenance practices could lead to an illicit discharge. Here are some tips to help you keep it green while you clean:

- Take your car to a commercial car wash or wash it on the lawn so that the wash water drains to a landscaped area. (Make sure to avoid parking over drinking wells or septic systems.)
- When pressure washing homes, garages or sheds, use the lowest setting and aim the wash water to a landscaped area. If possible, avoid using cleaning products and sweep/rake up paint chips to prevent them from entering stormdrains.
- Sweep sidewalks and driveways instead of using pressure washers (place swept up debris in garbage), or aim the wash water to a landscaped area.
- When cleaning carpets, filter and flush dirty water (if on sewer) or filter and spread over landscaped area if you are on a septic system (dirty wash water and cleaning agents can harm your septic system). If you are having your carpets professionally cleaned, ask the company about their wash water disposal policy first.
- Dispose of yard waste in a compost bin, yard waste bin or at a collection facility. Never dispose of yard waste in drainage ditches or stormwater ponds, as they interfere with the function of these stormwater facilities.

Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Receives \$30k for **Out-of-School Time Programs**

City of Des Moines Parks, Recreation & Senior Services, in partnership with the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA), has received a \$30,000 grant to support its out-of-school time healthy food access and nutritional literacy programs. The gift is part of a \$2.3 million grant NRPA received from the Walmart Foundation to support out-of-school time programs in 50 park and recreation agencies. The purpose of the grant is to:

- Increase the number of healthy meals children in low-income communities receive through the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) during outof-school times. All meals provided by the Des Moines Food Bank.
- Provide evidence-based, age-appropriate nutrition literacy to children that create behavior change by teaching the importance of healthy eating.
- Implement nutrition and physical activity standards that increase access to healthier foods and increase opportunities for physical activity.







National Recreation and Park Association

The City of Des Moines's grant will help increase access to healthy foods and improve opportunities for physical activity. Grantees will also receive additional support for meals provided through USDA afterschool and summer feeding programs as well as nutritional literacy materials to help ensure life-long healthy habits for Des Moines's youth.

This grant supports NRPA's new campaign-Commit to Health-which encourages the implementation and evaluation of Healthy Eating, Physical Activity (HEPA) standards in park and recreation sites across the country. NRPA's goal is to have at least 2,000 participating sites in five years.

According to the USDA's 2010 Hunger report, 16.2 million American children live in food-insecure households. The same report finds that 19.5 million low-income children receive free or reduced meals during the school year, but fewer than 3 million of these children participate in the Summer Food Service Program. During summer months, these children may not have access to quality food to help them grow-making the Recreation Department and the Des Moines Food Bank's work during out-of-school times that much more critical.

"Across the country, community parks and recreation are a vital health resource for all people," said Barbara Tulipane, President and CEO of NRPA. "This generous grant from the Walmart Foundation will allow park and recreation agencies to expand the critical work they do to improve quality of life and foster life-long healthy habits among the youth in their communities."





FROM THE CHIEF'S DESK

I'M FREOUENTLY ASKED ABOUT CRIME IN OUR COMMUNITY and what I'm doing about it. The staff of the Des Moines Police Department works hard at being a presence in our community; and we do the best we can to cover as much of the City with the allocated staffing. What does that mean? It means one supervisor and three to four officers per shift are responsible for responding to dispatched calls for service, transporting arrested subjects to jail, doing follow-up on open criminal cases, working speed enforcement in school zones or other emphasis areas, and writing reports and filing the appropriate paperwork with the court. Proactive patrolling is done with the left over time. The patrol division works a 12-hour shift and there are two shifts in a 24-hour period. Various parts of the day tend to be busier than others, such as commute times, weekends and holidays, good weather days, and during major sporting events such as Super Bowl. Being everywhere at once is not a possibility,





so we're doing the best we can to communicate and educate.

The Police Department has experienced a 7% increase in number of calls for service. In 2013, the DMPD responded to 21,025 calls for service, an increase from the 19,677 calls in 2012. The average response time to high priority calls is 3.42 minutes. High priority calls are calls where a suspect is present and/or the dynamics of the call necessitate the immediate presence of an officer for safety reasons. Our officers handled an average of 8.21 calls per officer, per shift in

2013. The average time on a call depends on the call type. Officers interview victims and witnesses, collect evidence, conduct interviews/interrogations of suspects, transport suspects and process them at the jail. Depending on the nature of the crime, this can take anywhere from 30 minutes up to two hours, then comes the writing of the report(s).

Our Crime Prevention staff is made up of two officers that work closely with neighborhood associations and businesses to provide training on crime trends with an emphasis on minimizing exposure in an effort to reduce crime. Block Watch and Business Watch are programs that encourage communication and train citizens and business owners on what they have to do to increase safety. In 2013, the Des Moines Police Department conducted 41 Block Watch meetings. Business Watch is a relatively new program to the City of Des Moines. The police department is coordinating with businesses to share the latest crime trends affecting businesses and providing training on creating a safer environment for employees and customers. Our Crime Prevention Officers meet with citizens on a daily basis to address the crime occurring in their respective communities. The Officers analyze the issues affecting a community, apply the appropriate crime prevention solutions, collaborate with patrol staff, and work with community members on the necessary crime prevention measures need to impact a problem.

As we approach the warm summer months, we ask everyone in our community to not only take steps to protect your property and possessions, but to communicate with your neighbors about things that do not appear normal, or about strangers in a neighborhood. Do not walk with your cell phone in plain view, be aware of your surroundings, and share crime prevention tips with those around you or anyone you feel needs the information. The Des Moines Police Department wants to be made aware of any crime or safety issues that you observe. As I stated earlier, being everywhere at once is not an option, so let's communicate and educate each other. It's important that one call 911 when criminal behavior is observed, or a situation that may result in someone being at risk exists. Another option would be to call the Des Moines Police non-emergency number at 206-878-2121 to let our Officers know. Our City Council continues to make public safety their priority, and I'm working with them on options to increase police department staffing. We appreciate the support of our community, especially those citizens who are inquiring about our evolving volunteer program. Please reach out to us on problems big or small. If they affect you, they may affect those around you. Let us help. Together with our community, we believe we can make our Des Moines a safe and increasingly desirable destination.

Resident Priority:

Effective January 1, 2010, the City of Des Moines implemented a Resident Discount Policy offering residents discounted fees for recreation programs. Non-residents and city residents who choose not to provide proof of residency will be assessed the full fee for programs.

The Resident Discount ("RD") Fee is available to residents living within the City of Des Moines' jurisdictional boundaries and Senior Adults. To qualify for the "RD" Fee participants must provide proof of residency such as: Valid picture ID with a Des Moines address, Valid picture ID accompanied by a utility bill with their Des Moines Address. Sports Teams qualify for the "RD" Fee when 51% of their players are Des Moines residents (proof of residency will be requested.)

The full program fee will be charged to participants who are not Des Moines residents or choose not to provide proof of residency. Questions related to residency should be directed to 206-870-6527

Registration Policies:

Pre-registration is required for all programs unless otherwise stated.

Registration is taken on a first paid basis. Returned check Fee: \$40 (plus 50% surcharge if collection action needed).

Refund Policy/Cancellations: When DMPR/SS cancels a program, a full refund or credit will be issued.

Refunds, less a \$10 administrative fee, will be granted when requested a minimum of 5-business days prior to the program/ course start date. The administrative fee will be waived if you opt for a credit to be used for another course/program. Credits must be used by the close of each calendar year.

- No refund will be issued for:


