Historic Treasure Unveiled July 1st

THE DINING HALL, BUILT IN 1934 located in Covenant Beach Bible Camp Historic District at Des Moines Beach Park (former home to the City's Senior Services) has been closed since 2002 due to the Nisqually Earthquake and Des Moines Creek flood damage. Since that time the City of Des Moines has worked extensively with federal, state, King County and heritage leaders to save, preserve and reopen this iconic building. **Please join us as we celebrate the reopening of the Dining Hall on July 1, 2015, 4:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.**

The Dining Hall was designed by Marvel Johnson, a former camper and one of the first female graduates from the University of Washington School of Architecture. The Covenant Beach Bible Camp Historic District consists of eight rustic craftsman style camp buildings, influenced by Swedish heritage, located within the eighteen acre Des Moines Beach Park, located at 22030 Cliff Avenue South. The setting includes Des Moines Creek which opens onto the saltwater beach of Puget Sound, archaeological components, natural features and a system of paths and trails connecting to the Des Moines Marina.

Phased construction projects over an eight year period include:

Phase 1 (2008): Structural stabilization and construction

of a new steel foundation spanning the creek, lifting the building three feet above the 100 year flood level, disconnection and capping and/or removal of deteriorated building utilities at a cost of \$1,207,011;

Phase 2 (2011-2012): Construction of ADA access to the building via ramps, decking and the replacement of exterior apron around building at a cost of \$476,450.

Phase 3.1 (2012) Modifications to Des Moines Creek with extensive berm walls, deepening and widening of the creek to keep it within its banks and to protect the Historic District at a cost of \$1,241,892; and

Phase 3.2 (2013-2015) Construction to install structural posts, beams and framing, repair dry rot, replace insulation and plywood sheer walls, install a fire suppression system and grease trap, update interior restrooms for ADA access, replace and reconnect utilities, plumbing, mechanical, electrical and HVAC systems, replace flooring, restore windows, replace doors, replace roof, gutters, downspouts, repair exterior siding and trim, add exterior lighting and paint the building at a cost of \$1,292,623.

Giving credit to the champions that worked with the City of Des Moines to save this resource by providing matching funds totaling \$1,934,000 include: 4Culture, King County Preservation Office, Washington Department of Commerce and Economic Development, Washington Historic Commission and Washington Heritage Capital Fund with leadership by former Gov. Christine Gregoire, State Senator Karen Keiser and State Representatives Tina Orwall, Dave Upthegrove, and King County Executive Dow Constantine.

Giving praise to the people and organizations that advocated tirelessly to save this resource include: Artifacts, Des Moines Creek Basin Committee, Des Moines Historical Society, Des Moines Landmarks Commission, Des Moines Legacy Foundation, Northwest Covenant Church Council, Seattle Southside Visitors Services, Washington Department of Archeology and Historic Preservation, and especially to the current and past Des Moines Mayor's and City Council's whose vision for the City is: An inviting, livable, safe waterfront community embracing change for the future while preserving our past. Lastly, this project would not have come to pass without the tireless leadership, dedication and passion of former Councilmembers Carmen Scott and Susan White.

NEWS & NOTES

Redondo Boardwalk Repair

As many in the community and region know, the Redondo Boardwalk was severely damaged during a November 2014 storm event and remains permanently closed until repairs can be made. Fortunately, the City has been able to secure approximately \$1,800,000 to restore the facility by building partnerships with state and federal officials. While this financial support covers in-kind replacement of damaged elements of the boardwalk, the City continues to seek additional funding to utilize more resilient materials such as concrete decking in lieu of timber.

Over the spring and summer months, the City will be working with an engineering consultant to finalize design and bidding documents as well as obtaining required permit approvals. Construction is anticipated to occur this fall and winter with the boardwalk reopening early 2016.

Saltwater State Park Bridge Seismic Retrofit

With much anticipation, construction activities on the 1934 Saltwater State Park Bridge are nearing completion. By the end of May the bridge and Marine View Drive should be open to traffic as well as all State Park amenities. The seismic retrofit work has included below and above ground work that is intended to bring the bridge into compliance with current seismic codes. This work will also ensure that the bridge serves the community for many years to come.

Housing Repair Assistance Program

The City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes.

SERVICES PROVIDED INCLUDE:

- Electrical faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans
- Plumbing faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters
- Disability Aids installation of grab bars, handrails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces
- Safety installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms & locksets
- Other faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

HOW DO I QUALIFY FOR THESE FREE SERVICES?

- 1. Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months and have proof of homeowner's insurance
- 2. Complete the application process

HOW DO I APPLY?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

- 1. Request an application by calling 206-870-6535
- 2. Complete the application forms and return them with the supporting documentation to the City of Des Moines/Minor Home Repair at 21630 11th Ave. S. Ste. D, Des Moines WA 98198
- 3. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.

OVER THE PAST YEAR, your police department has taken part in the Coffee with a Cop program in our community. Coffee with a Cop is a national program that we have tailored to

fit the Des Moines community. The program encompasses Police Department personnel sitting down with members of the community over a cup of coffee to have a simple dialogue. It is a great opportunity for citizens to talk to department personnel one on one about what concerns them. Some of the common themes have included: concerns over drug houses, speeding traffic, found drug paraphernalia, open air drug deals, prostitution, and the perception of a lack of police presence in their neighborhoods. Coffee with a Cop has provided us with the opportunity to explain why we respond the way we do and the challenges we face. One citizen recently asked me about a typical work day for a patrol officer.

l explained that our officers work three 12-hour shifts, and then take three days off. The shifts are made up of four officers and one Sergeant but with scheduled vacations or sick days, a typical shift is more often than not comprised of three officers and a Sergeant. Officers signing into service advise the dispatch center that they're available to take calls, which are holding for service, as they drive into work. This is due to our take home car policy; our officers are able to immediately assist by handling calls for officers that are on the end of their work shifts. This also helps to prevent unnecessary overtime costs, as well as allowing on-duty personnel with incomplete case reports to focus on completing those time sensitive documents before they go home. I should note that completion of these reports can take from one to three hours, depending on the complexity of the cases handled during the shift.

A typical day involves 12 hours of responding to calls for service. Calls that range from domestic violence incidents, traffic enforcement, burglary investigations, meeting with citizens regarding court orders, doing follow-up investigations on cases previously handled, assisting Fire/EMS on medical or fire calls, to responding for death investigations. As your Chief, I will say that I am proud of how well our personnel deal with these challenges

on a daily bases. Citizens comment to me regularly about the service a member of our agency provided. Our Officers are known for their innovation in providing exceptional service. From our supervisory staff dealing with staffing challenges in ways that do not compromise safety, but take into consideration the need to keep overtime costs down; to plans that Officers develop to address issues affecting neighborhoods during the course

of their shifts. Another aspect of an Officer's day is the emotional toll that high stress and traumatic call loads can impose. People call the Police Department to address problems when all else has failed and/or people are at a very low point psychologically, and Officers are tasked with removing themselves emotionally and responding in the best interest of public safety.

The Investigative Unit is made up of four Detectives, a Detective Sergeant, and an Evidence Technician. This unit will be the subject of a future City Currents article.

Our civilian personnel are the backbone that make our responding officers more effective. When a citizen calls or visits the Police Department, it is commonly a member of our civilian staff that they'll encounter. Our Records Personnel and administrative staff work around the clock to support our officers and the community with their needs and concerns. They process the reports that Officers submit, address

the needs of our Des Moines and King County Courts, handle issues related to pet licenses, gun permits, residential and business alarn public disclosure requests, and many other tightly regulated processes. These special individuals will be highlighted in a future City Currents article.

As we approach the mid-point of 2015, I ask you as a citizen to consider how you might serve the Des Moines Community as a citizen volunteer. If you have a special administrative/ computer skills, if you're a retired police or military member, if you're a retired educator and can help us with literacy outreach in the schools, please consider stepping forward and joining our growing team of Des Moines Police Volunteers. We're currently working to develop teams that do vacation house checks and assist with providing information at small and large events like Waterland Festival and the community 4th of July event. We're also open to your ideas for our growing volunteer program. Let us know how you can help.

No one wants to be bitten by a dog and we especially don't

want our children or pets to be attacked and bitten. Dog bites are painful and can cause additional health issues such as infections, scarring, and emotional trauma. According to statistics:

- Over 4.5 million people report dog bites annually and probably many more go unreported. Dog attack victims suffer over \$1 billion in monetary losses each year.
- Dog bite injuries are the fifth most frequent cause of emergency room visits for children each year; with the child's face being the most common body part to be bitten.
- Dog ownership and dog bites are on the rise; more people own multiple dogs now than ever before!

Dog Bite Prevention is an important part of our Animal Care and Control program in Des Moines. We frequently do public presentations and participate in public events, working within the community to educate citizens to help prevent injuries by dogs. Teaching adults and children to read canine body language, to approach and greet dogs properly, not to run and scream around dogs, and to leave dogs alone when appropriate, are important messages (among others) that we talk about.

We encourage EVERYONE to call Police/Animal Control for dogs running at large, especially if the dogs are acting threatening. We want to be proactive, so we can prevent dog bite injuries!

TIPS FOR DOG OWNERS

- · Alter (Spay/Neuter) their dog (most dog bites are caused by un-altered dogs)
- Socialize, desensitize, and obedience train
- Have their dog in the home and as part of their family
- Provide proper health/ veterinary care, and keep vaccines updated
- Provide adequate food, water, shelter, and exercise
 - Keep their dog under proper leash and/or fence control
 - License their dog and keep the license tag on at all times
- Micro-chipping is a great back-up form of ID, so we recommend that as well
- Don't keep your dog tied up on a chain
