

Director's Thank You to the Des Moines Community!

During my 23 year career with the City of Des Moines as its Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Director, I have had the great pleasure of working with extraordinary citizens, volunteers, staff, civic groups, private and public organizations, businesses and government.

The Department's Vision, "An Active Engaged Community", is realized every day because of passionate individuals that have served Des Moines on its Parks, Recreation, and Senior Services Master Plan Citizens Advisory Committee, Human Services Advisory Committee, Senior Services Advisory Committee, Arts Commission, Landmarks Commission and Lodging Tax Advisory Committee. The Department's programs led by hundreds of Youth Sports Coaches, Senior Services volunteers, Friends of Des Moines Creek, Friends of Sonju Garden, Park Adopt-A-Spot and Earth Day groups have made tremendous impacts through their collective contribution of more than 13,000 hours of time annually.

Authentic partnerships, collaborations and friendships have been developed between the Department and the Highline School District, Highline College, Highline Schools Foundation, Federal Way Public Schools, Rotary Club of Des Moines and Normandy Park. Destination Des Moines, Des Moines Area Food Bank, Des Moines Waterfront Farmers Market, Reach Out Des Moines, King County Library Services, Sound Generations, Catholic Community Services, Sea Mar Community Health Center, Seattle Southside Chamber of Commerce, Seattle Southside Regional Tourism Authority, King Conservation District, Port of Seattle, Midway Sewer District, Highline Water District, Cities of Normandy Park, SeaTac, Burien, Auburn, Kent, Tukwila and Renton, Des Moines Creek Basin Committee, King County and State of Washington, and with the many local businesses, places of worship, human services agencies and neighborhood groups that have contributed their support, funding and expertise.

Because of these relationships, the City has been able to offer hundreds of recreation, senior services, sports, arts, education and fitness activities and special events that have exponentially improved social, physical and mental health, environmental and economic benefits for all people living in Des Moines resulting in a safer, healthier and more inclusive community.

Federal, State, King County and private grant agencies, citizen donations and developer contributions matched City funds to acquire, construct, restore or enhance Des Moines Creek Park and Trail; Steven J. Underwood Memorial Park; Senior Services Activity Center; Des Moines Beach Park Auditorium, Dining Hall, Sun Home Lodge, Restroom and Picnic Shelter; Field House Park, Recreation Center, Grandstand and Picnic Shelter; Barnes Creek Trail; Cecil Powell Park; Dr. Shirley Gordon Park; Kiddie Park; Mary Gay Park; Midway Park; Parkside Park; Parkside Wetlands; Redondo Beach; Sonju Park; Water Tower Park; Westwood Park; Wooton Park; Woodmont Park; and Zenith Park. The Des Moines Legacy Foundation, a 501c3 non-profit which supports the programs and services of the Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Department, has worked diligently since 1999 to enhance the lives of Des Moines citizens, especially those



in need. In the last 20 years, the Foundation and its generous contributors have raised over \$2 million that have been invested in Steven J. Underwood Memorial Park, Des Moines Senior Activity Center, Daisy Sonju Garden, "No Kids Left Inside" Play Areas, Heritage Trail Signage, Fourteen Passenger Van, Recreation Scholarships for Children and Seniors, Medical Lending Equipment, Parkrun, Beach Park Summer Concerts, Art On Poverty Bay Outdoor Sculptures and Murals, Movies in the Park, Des Moines Waterfront Farmers Market, and programs at Midway Park. The Foundation's annual fundraising events include: Bayside Brunch at Anthony's Homeport in November, Bids for Kids at Beach Park Summer Concert Series in July, and Arts Gala on Poverty Bay at Beach Park Auditorium in September.

My heartfelt thanks and deepest respect goes to the Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Department professionals that embody the spirit of service for the betterment of our community! These outstanding team members are Senior Services Manager Sue Padden, Senior Services Program Specialist Natalie Lavoie, Senior Services Program Assistant Charisse Gregory, Facilities and Events Manager Shannon Kirchberg, Facilities and Events Specialist Sonja Cunningham, Recreation Manager Rick Scott, (former) Assistant Recreation Manager Taria Keane, Recreation Specialists Kelsey Cole and Kyle Ehlers, Administrative Assistant Janet Best, and the more than 100 part-time Recreation Leaders and Office and Facility Attendants. The City's parks, facilities and projects are well maintained and managed by Public Works Superintendent John Blackburn, Parks Lead Adam O'Donnell, Parks Maintenance Workers Phil Grager and Bob Remien, Building Maintenance Workers Dick Stites and Mike Drahosz and Public Works Project Manager Scott Romano. Along with the support of the City Council, and the City's Administration, Police, Public Works, Community Development, Finance, Legal, Court, and Marina Departments, these dedicated employees provide the life enriching programs, services and events at our parks, beaches and community centers to meet the needs and interests of our diverse and culturally rich community.

After a 39-year whirlwind career in the Parks and Recreation profession, I will retire from the Des Moines Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Director position on June 30th of this year. 



Ask an Expert

Dear Pet Owner: A current Des Moines pet license is your pet's "phone call home"!

PET LICENSE TAGS ARE IMPORTANT—if your dog or cat should run off or become lost, having a current license tag on your pet is the best way to bring him or her safely back home to you! Because we do the pet licensing at our police department in Des Moines, we have 24/7 access to pet owner information, so when your pet is found by a citizen or an officer, we can contact you immediately! Often times we can reunite you with your pet without even having to impound him or her to a shelter!

All Des Moines dogs and cats over the age of six months are required (per DMMC 8.04) to have a current rabies vaccine and be licensed with the city—failure to do so may result in fines and possible impoundment of your pet. Pet License tags are required to be worn on your pet's collar or harness anytime they are off their own property—but realistically they should ALWAYS be worn, as often when pets escape and run off, it is from their own home, and that is when they really need to have their tag on. Even indoor-only cats should wear their tag, as again, when they escape and are lost outside is when they need that identification on them.

Des Moines pet licenses need to be renewed annually—they are valid January through December of each year, however we do begin selling the next year's tags in October. We also have lifetime licenses for senior citizens 65+ who have altered

(spayed/neutered) pets. Annual dog and cat licenses are \$20 for altered pets and \$60 for un-altered pets, with 50% late fees after March 1, and 100% late fees after May 1. Lifetime licenses are free!

Micro-chips are a great back-up form of identification, and although they are not required, we highly recommend that all dogs and cats have a chip, too! But remember that micro-chips cannot be seen without a scanner/reader, so should NOT be considered a primary form of identification.

Please be a responsible pet owner: keep your pets under proper leash control, scoop after your pet, and keep a current pet license on them at all times! We want your pets to be safely at home with you, as much as you do!



Marina Redevelopment Update

HE CITY HAS ENGAGED IN A PROCESS TO REVIEW POSSIBLE DEVELOPMENT OPTIONS on the Marina floor. Last year the City received a grant from the Port of Seattle for Economic Development. The City matched the grant and hired a team of very knowledgeable consultants to review possible design options including review of current utility corridors and locations that could impact what the development options were.

The results of the consultant review were presented to the

City Council in May, 2017. Following their presentation, later in the summer, our City Council took a tour of development sites in Seattle focusing on Harbor Steps, Pike Place Market Expansion and development occurring in South Lake Union. Each of these featured mix-use developments and public amenities.

In October, 2017, the City held a Marina Community Open House to engage our residents and interested parties in an opportunity to express their preferences for the types of activities that could be included in redevelopment scenarios. Over 200 people attended this Open House that was held aboard the Argosy boat, The Goodtime II, which was generously donated for the event by Argosy. The results of the Open House are posted on the City's website as is also the bnsultant report from the May, 2017 presentation.



Going forward the city has received a Phase II grant from the Port of Seattle which is being used to identify the financing options for any redevelopment scenario. The consultants will present the results of their review to the City Council on June 21, 2018. At that point, with knowledge of what is possible, we will engage the community on an on-going basis to determine a course moving forward for Marina redevelopment based on design options, financial

feasibility and community preference. It will no doubt require public/private partnerships to move forward. The City is actively moving forward with plans to rebuild the vulnerable Marina bulkhead infrastructure. The Marina Bulkhead project is now live including a survey soliciting for public comments in relation to the restroom alternatives and urban design concept. Veterans, Seniors and Human Services Levy (VSHSL)

IT IS TIME FOR COMPETITIVE BRIDGE AT THE DES MOINES SENIOR ACTIVITY CENTER, and tables full of intensely focused card players fill the room. The competition isn't the only reason they're here today—companionship, a mental challenge and maybe even a slice of cake and cup of coffee are all part of the draw.

Des Moines Senior Activity Center is just one of 39 centers in King County that reach out to seniors in their community and offer them fitness programs, social activities, educational field trips, drop in games, support for independent living, social services and healthy meals.

These senior centers will serve as a vital piece of new King County funding coming from last November's voter-approved Veterans, Seniors and Human Services Levy (VSHSL). The levy gives service providers across the county the ability to connect veterans, residents over 55 years of age and vulnerable populations to services that will help them live healthy lives.

King County has developed a vision for the levy funds that will have a positive impact on peoples' quality of life through housing stability, social engagement and financial stability. This includes \$3.5 million that will be driven out specifically to these community-focused hubs where seniors can share a meal together, work out together and learn together. Connecting seniors to these services can mean the end of social isolation, a reduction in senior depression and an increase in senior physical health.

King County Councilmember Dave Upthegrove, who represents cities in South King County, has been meeting with senior centers and other community groups in order to solicit input, as he works closely with County agencies to ensure South King County senior centers have proper access to these funding opportunities.

"The senior centers in my district are doing amazing work to provide engaging programs and connection to community," said Councilmember Upthegrove. "These funds are a wonderful opportunity to further improve the quality of life for seniors in a variety of ways."



Housing Repair Assistance Program

THE CITY OF DES MOINES IS ONCE AGAIN PROVIDING MINOR HOME REPAIR SERVICES to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County.

Services provided include but are not limited to:

Electrical – faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans

Plumbing - faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters

Disability Aids – installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces

Safety – installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets

Other - faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

HOW DO I QUALIFY FOR THESE FREE SERVICES?

- 1. Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months, have proof of home owner's insurance, and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program.
- 2. Complete the application process

HOW DO I APPLY?

- 1. Request an application by calling 206-870-6535
- 2. Complete the application forms and return them with supporting documentation to the City of Des Moines/Minor Home Repair at: 21630 11th Avenue S, Suite D, Des Moines WA 98198
- 3. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.

South 251st Storm Outfall Project— Construction Award

THE CITY OF DES MOINES SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT is pleased to announce the construction of the permanent South 251st Stormwater Outfall has been awarded to Road Construction North West and is set to begin and be completed this summer.

The project will permanently stabilize and replace the temporary outfall. The permanent design includes removing the temporary outfall pipe, construction of an outfall energy dissipater from quarry rocks, installation of a new outfall pipe with quarry spall bedding, and placement of quarry spall for slope protection. The temporary outfall was installed after heavy rains in 2015 caused landslide repair work made on South 251st Street in 2014 to become unstable and undermine the stormwater discharge diffuser which threatened to undermine the retaining wall supporting the road and utilities.



Shoreline Master Program Periodic Review

THE CITY OF DES MOINES IS EMBARKING ON THE PERIODIC REVIEW OF THE SHORELINE MASTER PROGRAM, or SMP for short. The SMP provides the development standards for land use within 200 feet of the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM) of Puget Sound. It provides a comprehensive vision, the policy framework and regulations for how the shoreline area will be used and developed over time. Approximately 115 acres of prime real estate in the City is within 200 feet of Puget Sound and regulated by the SMP. Most of the Marina and much of Redondo is included in this area. To say the least, it's one of the City's most important documents.

The City's first SMP was adopted in 1972 after the Shoreline Management Act (SMA) was adopted by Washington State in 1971. The SMA is administered through a cooperative program between local governments and the Department of Ecology (Ecology), whereby local communities prepare a SMP that is adopted under guidelines established by Ecology. The City's current SMP was adopted in 2011 and it may be accessed at www.desmoineswa.gov.

Every eight years State law requires that the City conduct a periodic review of the SMP and this time the City has a deadline of June 30, 2019, to complete it. The purpose of this SMP periodic review is:

- · To assure that the SMP complies with current State law that has been updated since the City's last SMP amendment in 2011;
- · To assure consistency of the SMP with the City's comprehensive plan and development regulations that have been updated since the City's last SMP amendment in 2011;
- · To consider amendments to address changes in City policy, as directed by City Council; and
- To facilitate the submittal and review of projects by clarifying SMP content that it is not currently clear.

There will be a number of opportunities for the community to learn about and weigh in on the SMP periodic review. Outreach methods include a dedicated page on the City's website, open houses, local media updates (Waterland Blog and City Currents), Facebook, and City Council and Council Committee briefings.

The City's goal is that the SMP amendment will make it easier for residents, developers, and applicants to understand the permitting process as well as make the review of projects more efficient, saving everyone time and money.

AS THE WEATHER TURNS WARMER AND THE DAYS GET LONGER, our City comes alive with children playing in our parks, weekly concerts on the waterfront and walkers

out enjoying the return of the sunshine. I encourage you to check out this issue of the City Currents for a listing of the many summer activities we have to offer.

The City Council has been busy on a number of issues that have a direct impact on the health and wellness of our citizens. Last fall, the City Council approved the formation of an Ad Hoc Aviation Advisory Committee to help identify and resolve negative impacts that occur as a result of the City's proximity to Sea-Tac International Airport. The Aviation Advisory Committee is reviewing the frequency of operations at Sea-Tac, the

rallel impacts on local transportation, alth, and noise and the process to site and develop a second regional airport to ease the congestion at Sea-Tac. In February of this year, the Council passed Resolution No. 1378 which requests that the King County Council, the Puget Sound Regional Council, the State Legislature, and the Governor's Office take deliberate action to fund and implement means to cooperatively update an existing or, as needed, develop a new plan that will address the region's long term aviation capacity needs. On April 5, 2018 members of the Aviation Advisory Committee met with the Council in a Study Session to discuss next steps. The Aviation Advisory Committee is made up of citizens of Des Moines and meets monthly at City Hall with City staff. More information regarding all the activity of the committee can be found on the City's website

Many large developments are nearing completion and we are excited to learn that the Des Moines Theater project is ready to break ground. The Marina bulkhead repair/replacement project is ramping up and the S 223rd Street pavement project ould be complete by mid-summer.

In August, the City Council will be holding our annual budget retreat. In the last few years the City has seen a number of long term employees retiring from service and it has been a priority of the Council to ensure smooth transitions and continued high levels of service to our citizens. As a result, we will continue to look to staff to address succession planning in the near term and long term. Check out page 14 for a listing of staff who plan to retire, or have recently retired. and the newest additions to our team! On behalf of the Council I want to thank staff for
