Redondo Fishing Pier & Restroom Replacement Design Update

The design of the Redondo Fishing Pier & Restroom Replacement is currently underway. Preliminary design efforts are complete and federal permit applications have been submitted for federal review and permit issuance. Challenges remain with federal review and project delays continue across the region resulting in up to an additional 6-12 months before decisions are finalized. In the meantime, the fishing pier will remain closed to public use due to the existing facility condition and limited cost effective, short-term repair options.

Des Moines Marina North Bulkhead & Restroom Construction

The construction of the Marina North Bulkhead & Restroom building is currently underway.

With tremendous efforts, the City and the contractor had completed all in-water work activities including pile driving, tie-back anchors installations and removal of revetment materials, in one permitted fish window. These are truly the most significant structural elements of the project. The City will continue to accelerate the project construction activities with the ultimate goal to complete the project in 2022.

This summer, the contractor will be constructing the new restroom facility, sidewalks, urban design amenities, landscaping, and resurfacing the North Marina Parking Lot. Vehicular and pedestrian access will continue to be maintained to the greatest extent feasible around the construction site. The fishing pier is anticipated to remain open, with closures occurring as needed for the project construction activities in the immediate vicinity. The City is excited to share the rebuilt Marina North Bulkhead and its new facilities to the residents of Des Moines as soon as possible. In the meantime, we appreciate the patience and continued support from the community to get the project completed on schedule.

Housing Repair Assistance Program

The City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have “extremely low” to “low” incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County. Services provided include but are not limited to:

Electrical – faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans

Plumbing – faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters

Disability Aids – installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces

Safety – installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets

Other – faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

How do I qualify for these free services?

1. Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months, have proof of home owner’s insurance, and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program.
2. Complete the application process

How do I apply?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

1. Request an application by email at thickey@desmoineswa.gov or by calling (206) 870-6535
2. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.

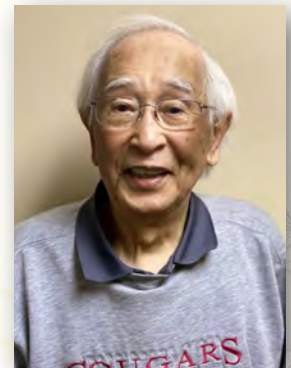
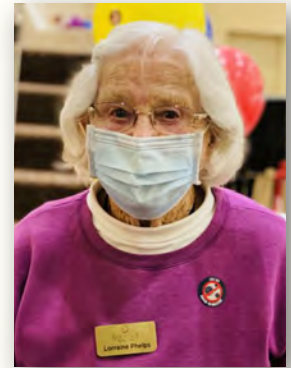

Summer Activities to Help Prevent Pollution in the Sound

It's finally summer time and Des Moines residents are venturing out into their yards to perform much-needed mowing and pruning. Everyone can help keep pollutants out of our waterways by adopting these simple habits into their daily life:

- *It is important to dispose of yard waste responsibly.* When grass clippings and other yard waste are improperly disposed of or allowed to enter local waterways, they can harm water quality.
- *Use natural lawn care.* Reduce the amount of fertilizers you use by mowing high and mulch mowing, if you do choose to fertilize use organic "slow release" fertilizers.
- *Avoid using pesticides and Weed-and-Feed products,* overuse of these products damages soil and plant health. Use alternatives such as building healthy soil with compost and mulch, plant pest-resistant plants, and pull weeds before they spread.
- *As a dog-owner, you can lead the way in cleaning up your local waterway by simply picking-up after your dog(s).* By being a responsible pet owner, you can set an example for others, before you know our waterway will be clean.
- *You can reduce bacterial pollution* by storing trash cans and garbage out of the rain, and by keeping a lid on trash while it's waiting to be picked up.

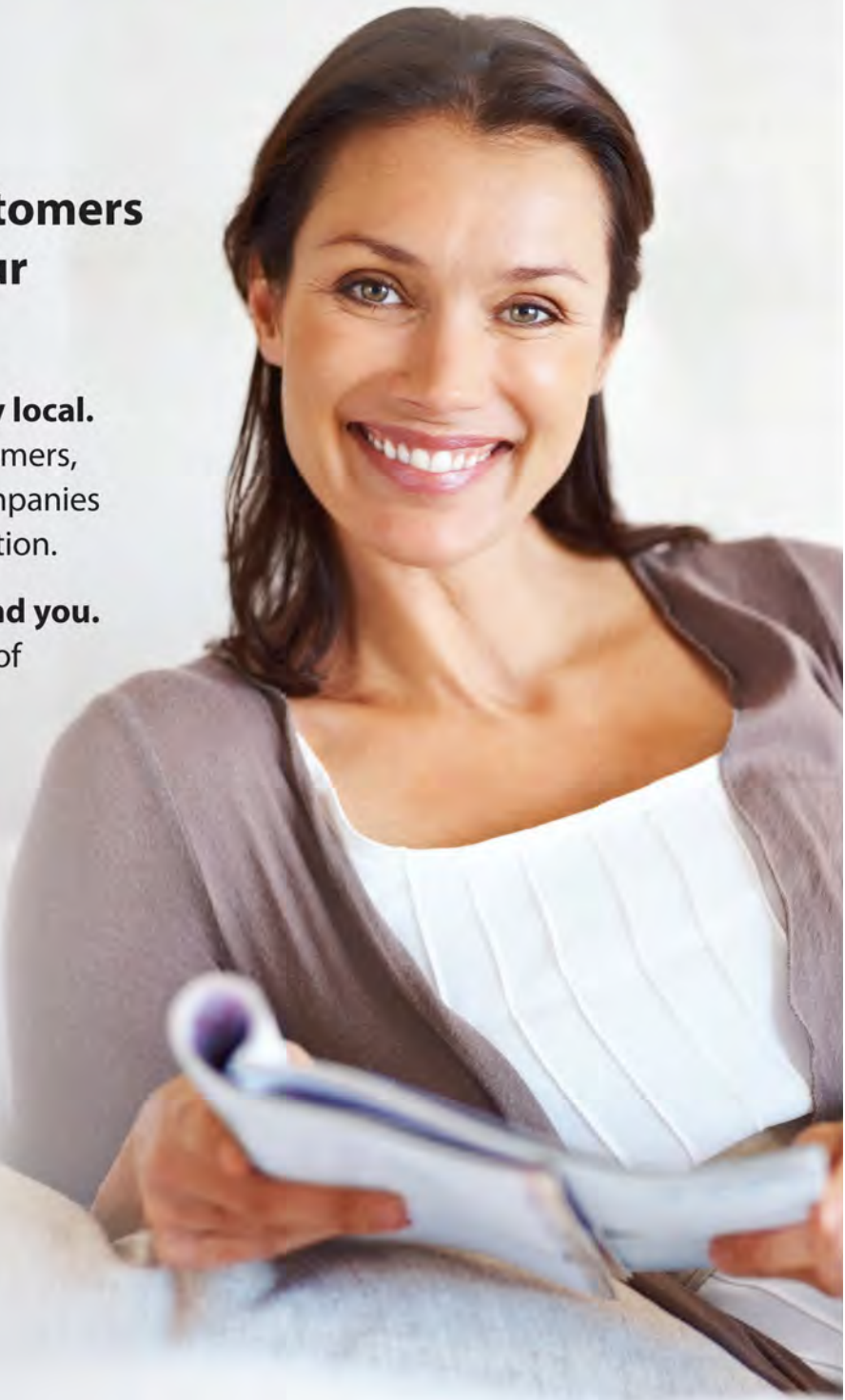
