Des Moines Creek Trail Waterfront Connection

More than 150 citizens celebrated the opening on October 6th



After more than a decade of planning, the long awaited Des Moines Creek Trail Waterfront Connection officially opened to the public on October 6th. This new segment of the Trail creates a vital pedestrian and bicycle link between Des Moines Beach Park, Marina and downtown Marina District and completes the trail from Puget Sound to its current terminus at the Midway Sewer Treatment Plant, continuing on to South 200th Street in SeaTac. The trail winds through more than two linear



miles of heavily forrested, salmon-bearing creek habitat and natural beauty.

As the cornerstone of the South King County's Lake to Sound Trail System, the trail will eventually connect to Lake Washington by linking to the Westside Trail in SeaTac, the Green River and Interurban Trails in Tukwila and the Two Rivers Trail in Renton.

With Des Moines Beach Park now on the National Register of Historic Places, and the commercial changes being explored at the Marina, we can expect more visitors will come to enjoy the Des Moines Marina District. Funding for trail design and construction was made possible by the Federal Highways Administration sponsored by U.S. Senator Patty Murray, the Washington Department of Transportation sponsored by Senator Karen Keiser, the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program, the Puget Sound Regional Council and the City of Des Moines.

Three Planning Agency **Members Needed**

The City of Des Moines is currently recruiting for three new members of the Planning Agency. The Planning Agency is a 7-member board that advises the City Council on land use and zoning matters. Typically this involves review of certain new development proposals such as subdivisions and planned unit developments, but may also involve recommendations on zoning and environmental decisions and general planning policy documents like neighborhood or comprehensive plans.

The Agency is scheduled to meet on the first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Meetings typically last for 1.5 hours. It is not unusual for the Planning Agency to meet less frequently based on the pending business activity each month. Interested individuals should be prepared to meet on average 6-8 times a year. Terms are four years.

DMC 5.04.020 states it is unlawful for a person to conduct any business within the City without first having a license or license registration to do so, or continue conducting business after such license or license registration is revoked. Operating a business without a license is unlawful in the City of Des Moines and can subject the individual to fines of up to \$513.00 per day.

Des Moines Transportation Gateway Project Update

The Transportation Gateway Project moved a step closer to construction when the City Council approved the 2nd Addendum to the 1st Development Agreement with the Port of Seattle on September 30th. The Port Commission approved the Addendum on November 2nd.

The Council's action vacates 7.68 acres of dedicated streets and sells 3.75 acres of deeded streets to the Port and purchases 2.84 acres of right of way along 24th Avenue South and S. 216th for Gateway road construction. The City will receive \$2.24 million from the Port to complete the transaction.

The design for Gateway construction is 85% complete, and has completed Federal and SEPA environmental reviews. When the project advances into construction in about a year, these roadways will be transformed into "complete streets" with two additional travel lanes, turn lanes, bicycle lanes, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, planter strips and a pedestrian friendly streetscape that shines on this major gateway to the City.

Over the next year the City will finalize roadway design, underground utilities and drainage systems, right of way planning, appraisals and eventually additional right of way acquisition. Construction is subject to available funding and the City is continuing to pursue state and federal grants.

Frontage improvements and/or fees will be required as adjoining properties develop which is expected to offset a significant portion of the costs.

As we all know, summer is gone and the rain has returned. Rain is part of our lives in the Pacific Northwest. Stormwater runoff is rain or snowmelt that flows from pavement areas, rooftops, and lawns into the nearest stream, creek, catch basin, or directly to Puget Sound - mostly without any treatment. Stormwater runoff poses a high risk to Puget Sound because it can transport everything in its way such as petroleum products, pesticides, animal waste, and construction runoff.

The City of Des Moines has joined with **Puget Sound Starts Here** to keep pollutants out of our water ways. Everyone can be environmental friendly by adopting these simple habits into their daily life:

- Use moderate fertilizer on your lawn.
- Make sure all garbage is placed into containers and protected from rainfall.
- Scoop up after your pet.
- Recycle your yard waste and do not dump yard debris or grass clippings near streams.
- Report to the Public Works Dept. any water discoloration or water sheen.



SCORE Correctional Facility

The South Correctional Entity Multijurisdictional Misdemeanant Jail, known as SCORE, is moving along at a fast pace and is approximately 45% complete. The landscaping surrounding the facility is in place. The curb, gutter and pavement work is about 80% complete. The roof structure work is complete and the roofing material installation will be completed in December. The interior construction and installation of housing units is well underway. The electrical system in this building

is extremely complex due to the nature of the occupancy and the high level of automation that is needed. Since the City provides electrical inspections, knowledge of the entire system is needed.

The SCORE website, www.scorejail.org, has updated information and pictures of the construction. The SCORE project is scheduled for completion by September of 2011.

Lower Des Moines Creek Channel Improvements – Completion Delayed Due to Weather

Due to poor weather conditions during September, the creek work within Des Moines Beach Park has been suspended until next July. The City's contractor, KC Equipment, was making excellent progress dredging nearly 1500 yards of material from the creek, reshaping the side tributary behind the Sun Home Lodge and was in the process of excavating the foundation for the new floodwall, when two large storms overcame the bypass system that was set up to divert flows around the work area. The work crews were not able to reconstruct the bypass system and dewater the site and still meet the Department of Fish and Wildlife/US Army Corps of Engineers'deadline of October 1st for completing the project. Remaining work items include constructing the floodwall and earthen berm downstream of the vehicular bridge to the Founder's Lodge, complete shaping of the channel downstream of the vehicular bridge, constructing a sediment trap that will be used to collect future gravel deposits and completion of streamside habitat and wetland restoration. Work will resume on July 1 and is anticipated to be completed mid-August 2011.

Des Moines Crime Rate Drops 13%

Part I Crime Rate Totals Reduced by Over 13% from 2008 to 2009

The City of Des Moines is pleased to announce a dramatic drop in crime for the year 2009, the reflection of an intensive strategic effort to counter criminal activity that began with voter's approval of a levy lid lift in May 2006. The reduction stands in direct contrast to a rise in the Part 1 Crime Rate totals for all of King County.

Statewide and nationally, a vast majority of law enforcement agencies report the number of specific crimes to the FBI as part of a national program known as the "Uniform Crime Report" publication. The Crime Index is composed of eight specific criminal offenses. These crimes are chosen to serve as indicators of our nation's crime experience because of their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and the likelihood of reports being made.

The number of reports submitted by the Des Moines Police Department for the one year period from 2008 to 2009 reflects an overall reduction of just over 13.7 percent in the Part I Crimes Index.

Per the Crime Index, the violent crimes of homicide, aggravated assault, forcible rape, and robbery were down 2.6 percent. Property crime totals, measuring arson, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor-vehicle theft were down 14.9 percent. The report shows percentages for these same crimes over the same time period are up an average of 5.9 percent for all of King County.

Motor-vehicle theft shows the greatest reduction of 23%, with a reported total of 161 which is down from the previous year of 209. Burglaries also showed a noticeable decrease, down about 10% from 255 to 229. Rape showed a 28.6% increase; 18 were reported in 2009, an increase from 14 reported the previous year. Arson showed the greatest percentage increase, having doubled from 4 to 8.

So far in 2010, the overall improvement appears to be sustained, with a mixture of increases and decreases in various categories.

January to September of 2010 Part I Crime Rate totals, when compared to 2009 totals for the same months, show a violent crimes reduction of 16%. The same comparison shows property crimes up 5%. The combined Part I Crime Rate totals are currently reflecting an increase of 3%.

Crimes are classified into two parts - Part 1 crimes are measured nationally and statewide

and are often used as a significant indicator. However, many of the reports and crimes dealt with on a daily basis by the Des Moines Police department (any police department) are not reflected in this statistic (Part 1 Crime Totals). Common crimes not measured include identity theft and other crimes of fraud, common property crimes, violation of court orders such as domestic violence protection and no contact orders, DUI's, traffic collisions, vehicular assaults and vehicular homicide.



Marina District Planning Update

In August 2010, the Marina District Stakeholder Group was formed to provide input and ideas about how best to revitalize the Marina District. The Stakeholders represent each of Des Moines nine neighborhoods, residents, property owners, businesses, Arts Commission, Planning Agency, community organizations, and public agencies. To date, the Stakeholder Group has met three times and plans to meet again in early 2011.

General observations ranged from defining needs to suggesting solutions. Establishing gateways and incorporating artwork into the Marina District were seen as "quick wins" that were easy to implement and demonstrated that the City cares about its image and has a vision for its future. The view potential was identified as an asset and it was suggested zoning standards need to allow taller buildings where views are not compromised. Green space, trees and landscaping were also deemed important elements that contributed to the sustainability and attractiveness of the area.

Ideas from the Stakeholder Group are being illustrated using Google SketchUp modeling software. This work will be refined through a developer/property owner forum, community meetings, and discussions with the Planning Agency and City Council. Snow and Ice Event Priorities and Operations

During snow and ice events, the City's maintenance crews are out very early in the morning or late at night to provide the safest possible driving conditions for its citizens, the commuting public, and emergency vehicles that use our City's rights-of-way.

Potential Locations for Roadway Closures

Public Works crews respond on notice to snow and ice concerns in case of heavy snow fall or black ice conditions. Crewmembers may close steep hills and streets that have a history of icy conditions. The following is a list of streets that may be closed:

Snow Plowing & Sanding

The first priority for anti-icing, plowing, and sanding applications is for life-line and emergency response route. After these primary roadways are cleared, other arterial roadways, and eventually residential streets can be addressed. The amount of snow or ice is the deciding factor in how soon residential areas are serviced. Depending on weather conditions, sometimes main arterials require repeated plowing or sanding which delays the lesser priority areas.






