AS THE YEAR COMES TO A CLOSE and we embark on the holiday season, I feel it's important to talk about the many successes for 2019.

Our Police Department is now fully staffed. Chief Thomas has been working

in partnership with federal agents, as well as state and local law enforcement officers to provide high visibility police presence in the south end of town. In January, the City Council approved a lease agreement with Redondo Square at 272nd and Pacific Highway for the operation of the Des Moines Police Substation. Des Moines law enforcement staff utilize this office space which also houses several multijurisdictional task forces (including FBI agents and US Marshalls), that focus on violent crimes, gangs and gun violence. This strategic approach to law enforcement utilizes vertical integration of federal, regional and local assets to address violent crimes, gangs and drug crimes. It is one of the first of these kind of partnerships in the nation.

Development activity and future growth opportunities remain strong. Some of the highlights for this year:

- The Des Moines Theater renovation project continues to progress with most of the construction happening either inside the facility or in the alleyway in conjunction with the alleyway utility undergrounding project.
- The Van Gasken property purchase was completed using primarily grant funds, and landscaping design work is in progress.
- The S 216th Street roadway improvement project is on track and scheduled to be completed in early 2020.

- The City partnered with Metro Community Connections to expand service between the Angle Lake light rail station and the Des Moines Marina District with mid-day and Saturday service.
- Fully grant funded property acquisition in the Pacific Ridge Neighborhood for the purpose of expanding Midway Park, adding just short of a half-acre of park property.
- Wesley \$250M campus renovation/ expansion project is underway and on track.
- Waterview Crossing, a 326 unit affordable housing/mixed use project in the Pacific Ridge Neighborhood is nearing completion.
- The completion of Havenwood, a new Polygon Northwest home development just south of 272nd Street, and Pacific Heights by DR Horton at South 279th Street and Hwy 99.
- Marina redevelopment planning continues to move forward. The goals for this work is to connect the Marina to the downtown through development of a Marina Steps, similar to Harbor Steps in Seattle. The focus will be on integrating improvements to the Marina waterside with development on the landside of the Marina.
- We continue to reap the benefit of a three step bond upgrade the City received from Standard & Poors to AA+ in late 2018.
- City Administration has worked to enhance communication skills among key staff by engaging a communications coach to work on enhancing skills.

The City celebrated its 60th Anniversary with a number of summer events. The legendary Randy Hansen, American guitarist, known throughout the world for his Rock Tribute Act honoring the late Jimi Hendrix kicked off the summer events, which included summer concerts, community barbeques, a car and wooden boat show and the annual Waterland Parade!

Collaborative City Council and staff work with SCORE resulted in a significant decrease of several hundred thousand

dollars in costs to the City in 2020. This is the result of refinancing the existing South Correctional Entity (SCORE) Jail facility bonds and positive improvements in their budget process. Additionally, due to the City of Des Moines' drastically improved financial status, the City will also become a "Member City" with an equity position in the SCORE Jail.

The 2020 Annual Operating Budget is solvent, strong and sustainable. The budget was developed to ensure accountability, transparency and excellent delivery of programs and services to the community. The City continues to build a sustainable organization that emphasizes best practices in financial management to assure a bright future for our City. We have listened and sought input from the community as well as employees.

The recommended budget addresses future attrition, enhances succession planning, and maximizes the efficient allocation of resources to accomplish Council's policies and direction.

In August, City Manager Michael Matthias received the 2019 Award for Excellence, the Washington City/County Management Association's (WCMA) top award that recognizes an outstanding administrator or manager who has enhanced the effectiveness of local elected officials and consistently initiated creative and successful programs. The emphasis of the award was to acknowledge City Manager Matthias' efforts to make the City financially strong and solvent for the long term. This award was presented to Michael at the August 14, 2019 WCMA Summer Conference in Kennewick. Washington.

The City is in good hands and moving forward. On behalf of the entire City Council, I wish you a wonderful holiday season and look forward to the opportunities to continue making our City the best it can possibly be.

The New and Improved Shoreline Master Program is Complete!

he City of Des Moines has completed its required periodic review of its Shoreline Master Program, or SMP for short. The SMP provides a comprehensive vision, the policy framework, and regulations for how the shoreline area will be used and developed over time. Approximately 115 acres of land is regulated by the SMP and it's one of the City's most important documents.

During this periodic review, Des Moines updated the SMP to comply with current State law, clarified content to facilitate submittal and review of projects, and made changes that include:

- Allowing for light commercial water-related uses such as kayak rentals in the Beach Park and Saltwater State Park;
- Allowing for Marina maintenance dredging without the requirement of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP);
- Raising the cost threshold that allows for renovation of nonconforming structures within the shoreline.
- Clarifying that residential sheds, patios, cabanas, and hot tubs may be permitted through a shoreline exemption.
- Allowing for dive parks without requiring a CUP or shoreline variance.

The City's Planning Division coordinated several events for the public to provide feedback. A Public Hearing was held on April 11, 2019 and City Council adopted the newly amended SMP on July 11, 2019. The City hopes that the new SMP will make it easier for Des Moines residents and developers to understand the shoreline permitting process and requirements. Housing Repair Assistance Program

he City of Des Moines is once again providing minor home repair services to City resident homeowners who have "extremely low" to "low" incomes based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) income guidelines. This is done by providing free repair services to improve the health and safety of our residents as they live in their homes. Funding for this program is provided by a Community Development Block Grant through King County.

Services provided include but are not limited to: **Electrical** — faulty lights, switches, plugs, circuits or exhaust fans

Plumbing — faulty toilets, clogged drains, leaking faucets, faulty water heaters

Disability Aids — installation of grab bars, hand rails, hand held showerheads, bath seats, high toilets, access ramps and application of non-skid surfaces

Safety — installation of smoke alarms, security/safety lights, carbon monoxide alarms and locksets

Other — faulty furnaces, faulty gutters and roof leaks, broken window glass panes

How do I qualify for these free services?

- Be an owner/occupant within the Des Moines city limits for at least one year with no intention of selling in the next 12 months, have proof of home owner's insurance, and meet the HUD income guidelines for the program.
- 2. Complete the application process

How do I apply?

To apply for this program please follow these directions:

1. Request an application by calling (206) 870-6535



- Complete the application forms and return them with the supporting documentation to the City of Des Moines/Minor Home Repair at: 21630 11th Avenue S, Suite D, Des Moines WA 98198.
- 3. Once your application is processed and evaluated you will receive a phone call informing you of your acceptance or non-eligibility for our program. Upon acceptance your job will be referred to one of our contractors who will call you to make an appointment to perform those services. Services that are required for your health and/or safety are the highest priority.





Redondo Fishing Pier Replacement

he City will begin design and permitting efforts in 2020 for complete replacement of the Redondo Fishing Pier. It is expected that this initial process will take approximately one to two years to complete to ensure the new facility has an expected service life of 40+ years, similar to the recent Redondo Boardwalk Replacement project. Depending on funding and final design, construction will then take approximately

one year to complete. In the meantime, the fishing pier will remain closed to public use due to the existing facility condition and limited cost effective, short-term repair options.



MEMORIAL BENCH DONATION PROGRAM




New sites are available in the Marina and South Marina Park.

es Moines is rich in beauty and natural resources that include the Puget Sound shoreline, hillsides and bluffs, urban forests, diverse streams and wetlands, fish, wildlife and open space. Areas that provide critical environmental functions are classified as 'environmentally critical areas' (ECAs) and 'shorelines' both of which require protection to keep our environment safe and under local and state law. Regulations protecting these areas are found in Title 16 Environment of the Des Moines Municipal Code and the Shoreline Master Program that can be accessed on the City's website: www.desmoineswa.gov

Does my property have an ECA or Native Growth Protection Easement?

To see if your property has mapped ECAs, go to our Geographic Information System (GIS) page at: https://dmwa.maps.arcgis. com/home/index.html, click on the 'Des Moines Critical Areas' map under Featured Apps and search by address or parcel number. These maps are just advisory, and if you are applying for a development permit, we will use detailed property information, such as a topographic survey or professional wetland report, to confirm if an ECA is present.

Some properties have a 'Native Growth Protection Easement' (NGPE) which is a permanently protected critical area, a critical area buffer or both. Current and future landowner(s) of the NGPE, are the custodians of important environmental features and are responsible for protecting and preserving these areas in their natural state. Most NGPE's have signs and fencing along their perimeter placed when they were first established. Sometimes signs are removed or damaged and are no longer in place. If you think you may have an NGPE on your property, but there are no signs, you can check the property title, King County Records or contact a City planner.

Critical areas and permitting...

If you plan to build, expand, redevelop, clear or grade your property, you will need to know the exact location of any critical

areas or buffers on your property. You may need a formal critical area delineation and/or study to submit for permitting. City staff can advise you of what you will need for your particular project.



Landslides can result in enormous public and private costs, and severe threats to public safety and natural resources. Scientific research shows that unstable slopes are best protected by undisturbed buffers.

What happens if someone alters or disturbs a critical area?

If critical areas are disturbed, the critical area will need to be restored at the owner's expense. This typically includes costs for environmental specialists to assess the impacts and develop a restoration plan. It can also lead to monetary penalties if the restoration is not completed.





REGISTRATION POLICIES:

Pre-registration is required for all programs unless otherwise stated. Registration is taken on a firstpaid basis. Returned check fee: \$40 (plus 50% surcharge if collection action needed).

RESIDENT PRIORITY:

Effective January 1, 2010, the City of Des Moines implemented a Resident Discount Policy offering residents discounted fees for recreation programs. Non-residents and city residents who choose not to provide proof of residency will be assessed the full fee for programs. The Resident Discount (RD) Fee is available to residents living within the City of Des Moines' jurisdictional boundaries and senior adults.

To qualify for the RD Fee, participants must provide proof of residency such as: valid picture ID with a Des Moines address or valid picture ID accompanied by a utility bill with their Des Moines Address. Sports teams qualify for the RD Fee when 51% of their players are Des Moines residents (proof of residency will be requested). The full program fee will be charged to participants who are not Des Moines residents or choose not to provide proof of residency. Questions related to residency should be directed to (206) 870-6527.

REFUND POLICY/ CANCELLATIONS:

When DMPR/SS cancels a program, a full refund or credit will be issued. Refunds, less a \$20 administrative fee, will be granted when requested a minimum of five business days prior to the program/course start date.

- No refund will be issued for: Programs costing \$10 or less
- Programs where admission fee was purchased in advance
- Special events

Medical illness or other extenuating circumstances will be handled on a case-by-case basis. Documentation of circumstance may be requested.






